

the east is empty. All the fire helicopters departed at the end of October.

July 1 to December 2020-2022



Airport Operations: The Flight Aware graph shows activity for the last 3 years from July to December. The highest blue spike shows the peak of the Caldor fire on Sept 5, 2022, with 73 operations (landings and takeoffs) per day. The light blue spike is the Mosquito fire that peaked on Sept 15, 2022, with 48 operations. The faint vertical line on the chart is today's date, Nov 13. The time interval on the x axis is 180 days. Operations have declined 25% from last year as the light blue line indicates. The area under the curve represents 2020 (dark blue), 2021 (orange), and 2022 (lite blue). Why the precipitous decline in airport operations? Look no further than the price of aviation fuel.

Price of Avgas 100LL

September of last year, 100LL was less than \$4 per gallon. Now it is above \$6.50 across the US.

Looking at the Flight Aware data above over the past 3 years, flight operations at PVF are down by 25%. This is largely correlated to the price of fuel. The price at PVF is exactly the national average of \$6.68.

Hangar Use Update

The box hangar H19 next to Hal's hangar was finally vacated 5 years after the death of the owner. Why did it take so long? Three aircraft had to be repaired, dismantled, and sold by the widow. Any hint of a hangar for sale can start a bidding war due to the scarcity of hangars. In the five years, the hangar probably went up in value 10% each year.

The FAA hangar use policy states that a hangar must be used for aviation purposes, not for storage of personal property. But ask the question: How long can a hangar be vacant? I know of three hangars that are vacant, including one for nearly 4 years. The demand for hangar space is very high with no relieve in site. No one I have asked can give me a definitive answer.

Chapter Membership: Unofficial Chapter membership listed on MailChimp at the beginning of the year was 118. Today membership has grown to 148. NEW CFI for C150: Cindy Ashmead is an RN at Marshall, CFI, CFII, owes a C-182, tenant of the airport and gives flight reviews. She is a dedicated instructor and great mentor for young aspiring student pilots. She brought in a new student, Vanessa Densmore, who started her first lesson last month in my C-150.

New Ray Aviation Scholar: Sam Garcia of Placerville graduated from high school last year and is attending Folsom Lake College studying mechanical engineering. He was selected and approved by the chapter board for the 50/50 matching fund scholarship. He will start flight lessons in November and should earn his private pilot certificate by next summer.

Adopt-A-Highway Program: Our first workday is November 19. The chapter is assigned the 2-mile section of Highway 50 between Exit 34 and Exit 35, between Cambridge Road and Cameron Park Road in 2 Hwy 50 Exit 34 to Exit 35



both directions. If you want to volunteer for the program, contact Judi or Jim W. to get on the list. A 15-minute training video is required. Our plan is to meet one Saturday each month at McDonalds, usually the 3rd weekend, and begin walking the shoulder facing traffic at 9AM . A dozen people will split into two groups and spend about two hours collecting litter. For our

efforts, the chapter will earn \$500 per month. This is a 5-year contract. We currently have 25 people not counting spouse on the list. We can make this fun and rewarding by taking those earnings to build our scholarship fund and hangar improvement fund.




