We had great turnout for our Young Eagle / Eagle Flight events. We hold monthly IMC & VMC discussions. Our younger members put together an R/C aircraft under the Build and Fly program. We support two scholarship programs; National's Ray Scholarship and our own Sunny Atkins Scholarship. We had progress on a number of members' projects. And, even though the state's Adopt-A-Highway program lost funding last year, we found alternate revenue sources to fill that void.

So, how, as a new Board, do we follow that? Obviously, we're going to keep doing what we do well... Pancake Breakfasts, Summer Picnics, Eagle Flights, etc. Still, we've lined up a number of projects aimed at enhancing our Chapter:

- **Ground School** This year's Ground School will be offered every Saturday morning, 9:30-12:30, for 10 weeks, starting January 11th. We're asking you, our members, to come on out to the classes to help the instructor. We just want you to hang out and help students that are having trouble with a particular concept. A little "non-teacher" input can go a long way to clarifying and motivating.
- Meeting Programs We'd like to have our members help with the meeting programs. We all have interesting experiences that we like to share. What we're looking for is short presentations (15-30 minutes) on a project, a construction technique, or anything else you think would be of interest to the group.
- Web Presence Our Website is a window for potential new members to see what we're about. We've all been lax in providing photos of our projects. We're going to have a real push to shine more light on what we're building, restoring, and flying.
- Facility Enhancement Our hangar is old. It needs repairs and weatherproofing. That will be one of the Board's top priorities. We will be coming to you, our members, for help and suggestions.
- **Committees** We currently have 26 different committees that support the Chapter's various programs and efforts. We will be posting a list of those committees. Anyone wishing to help on a committee is welcome to contact the committee chair and join in.


Armament

 Six M1A1 Bazooka Rocket Launchers firing M6A1 HEAT rockets

Charles Carpenter, a mild-mannered high school history teacher turned WWII pilot, became a legend of daring and creativity. Known alternately as *Bazooka Charlie* and *The Mad Major*, Carpenter took the unarmed L-4 Grasshopper, a lightweight artillery-spotting plane, and transformed it into Rosie the Rocketer, a makeshift tank-busting machine. Refusing to accept his plane's intended passive role, he strapped six M1 Bazookas to its wings, rigging them to fire from the cockpit. This ingenious act allowed access to the panzer's weaker top armor, an immediate tactical advantage over the front-facing thicker armor normally attacked via the ground. Carpenter's daring antics began in earnest in October 1944 when, flying low and slow, he personally destroyed five German tanks and an armored car in a single month. This remarkable feat earned him a reputation as both a hero and a madman. As Carpenter famously quipped, "It's my job to blow up tanks, and I love my job!"

Rosie, the military version of the J-3 Cub, was so slow it could barely outrun a motorcyle: Carpenter had to fly dangerously low and close to enemy tanks, often making himself a sitting duck. Yet his boldness paid off, inspiring awe and terror among both Allied troops and the Germans, who began targeting Cubs more aggressively. Carpenter's incredible escapades proved that innovation and audacity could transform even the humblest aircraft into a weapon of legend, cementing his place in history.


