Once while having lunch at Auburn, I witnessed a larger helicopter taxiing by a row of planes and one Cessna 152 had it's vertical stabilizer damaged from the rotor wash whipping the tail back and forth. 

GGAZC ANNOUNCES STAGE 1 WINNERS Rob Bulaga

Last year, GoAERO launched the <u>GoAERO Prize</u>, a global competition committed to inspiring the creation of Emergency Response Flyers that rescue people in danger and respond to disaster wherever it is found. With more than \$2 million in prizes, the competition will create safe, portable, robust, autonomy-enabled flyers. Teams competing in the GoAERO Prize will compete over a three-year period and benefit from expert mentorship, global exposure, access to software, products and services, and monetary prizes.

The competition is broken down into three stages. Stage 1 was the preliminary design of a concept vehicle, describing the technical approach and project plan. Stage 2 is the fabrication of a subscale, proof-of-concept vehicle. Stage 3 will be the final fly-off of full-sized aircraft.

GoAERO is currently composed of 198 teams from 85 countries around the globe. Last month, GoAERO announced its Stage 1 Winners. **My company, Trek Aerospace** (<u>www.trekaero.com</u>), is proud to be one of those 11. Our Stage 2 aircraft is already under construction.

The innovative aircraft being developed through this competition will be equipped with cutting-edge technology to perform rescue and response missions after natural disasters, medical emergencies, and other humanitarian crises; technology that has the potential to save countless human lives. In the wake of wildfires in California, flooding in Valencia, and congestion snarling traffic around the world, these autonomy-enabled emergency response aircraft are needed now more than ever.

\$10,000 was awarded to each of the 11 Stage 1 winners. They are:

- A2 Cal (Berkeley, California, United States)
- CraneAero (Cranfield, United Kingdom)
- Elevate (Delft, Netherlands)
- Harmony (College Station, TX and Stillwater, OK, United States)
- HORYZN (Munich, Germany)
- LIFT + UT Austin / Texas Aerial Robotics (Austin, Texas, United States)
- MOSTAVIO (Toronto, Ontario, Canada)
- MOYA AERO (Sao Jose dos Campos, Brazil)
- Penn State University (State College, Pennsylvania, United States)
- Tartan Air Rescue (Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, United States)
- Trek Aerospace (Folsom, California, United States)




