# RAY AVIATION SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT

Award, part of annual \$1.2 million Ray Aviation Scholarship program

On July 8, 2020, **Andrew Gordon**, a recent high school graduate and a member of Chapter 512 and son of Judi and Glenn Gordon of Cameron Park is the recipient of the Ray Aviation Scholarship. This is a unique full-scholarship opportunity for flight training, thanks to EAA Chapter 512 of Placerville and the Ray Aviation Scholarship program administered by the Experimental Aircraft Association in Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Andrew is one of about 100 scholars to receive the award for 2020, only the second year of scholarship.

The Ray Aviation Scholars program provides up to \$10,000 scholarships to young people who are seeking to learn to fly. The Ray Foundation has provided \$1.2 million to fund the scholarship program, which seeks to improve the flight training success rate from the current industry standards of 20 percent to 80 percent for program participants. Local EAA chapters are responsible for identifying youth for the Ray Aviation Scholarship program and mentoring them through flight training. The Ray Foundation is furthering the legacy of James Ray, an EAA lifetime member who was dedicated to aviation and youth education.

In the first year of the program, 105 scholars were awarded flight training scholarships. The success rate for those scholars is likely to exceed the goal of 80 percent.

Andrew will be training at Foothill Flight Center, based at the Cameron Park Airport. The scholarship is designed to support a flight student through both written and practical segments of flight training that are part of successful FAA pilot certification. Andrew is seeking a Sport Pilot certificate in a light sport aircraft. The flight school is ideal for Andrew since he lives across the runway from the school and they operate a light sport aircraft. He will be able to don a yellow vest and carry his hand-held radio and walk or march across the runway exercising extreme caution! As part of his qualification for the scholarship, he had to show a serious and keen interest in aviation by participating in a Young Eagle flight. He did five YE flights plus ride along with his parents, both avid pilots, on many flights in different aircraft since he was a young boy.



Andrew is pursuing an aggressive program which must be completed with a check ride for his certificate within one year. His intention is to complete the major tasks of solo in less than two months, FAA written exam in less than 6 months, and complete his FAA check ride before he reports to training in the US Air Force early next year. His goal in the Air Force is to become an air traffic controller. The chapter wishes Andrew well as he embarks on his new aviation career as a pilot and future member of the U.S. Air Force.

EAA chapters play a critical role in the success of the Ray Aviation Scholarship program. Chapters interested in participating are prequalified by EAA through an application process. If selected, they mentor and support the scholarship recipient throughout their flight training journey. Once selected as a Ray Aviation Scholarship Fund participant, candidates also commit to volunteer service with the local EAA chapter.

EAA Chapter 512 is one of 900 local chapters of the Experimental Aircraft Association, the world's largest organization for recreational flying. 

Hamilton Cove Seaplane Base, Catalina Island, California. Image taken early 1930s. I found this image in Oregon over the weekend and it took me completely by surprise. I never thought about sea planes landing at Catalina Island! In 1931, the base shown in this image was constructed by Philip Wrigley at Hamilton Cove, which is north of Avalon. It had an unique turntable at the top of the runway which allowed for an easy turn around of planes. The base operated until it was closed after the beginning of WWII. ## Business from the Floor, Changes to Agenda - none

**Board Member Reports** 

#### ➤ Al Herron – President

- Due to COVID-19 postponed meetings and events, the Chapter budget has been revised by slipping it back one year. The draft 2021 Budget and its revised timeline are available in our GoogleDocs folders.
- Spirit of Aviation Week, aka Virtual Oshkosh, will be held July 21 25.
- Dick Wampach is stepping down as the IMC/VMC Club moderator. We need someone to fill his
  position if we want to continue the program. We will announce this need in the Stobe.
- We continue to utilize our down time to work on existing hangar projects. We still need to
  establish timelines for task completions and to break out individual tasks for volunteers.
- We need a coordinator to plan Bob O'Hara's October memorial service. So far suggested plans include:
  - Asking for a volunteer coordinator at next week's General Meeting
  - Having a food truck cater the event (COVID-19 guidelines prevent us from preparing our own food)
  - Having the CAP Honor Guard, from Lincoln, participate in the memorial
  - Having Vultures Row, from Cameron Park, participate in the memorial
  - Change the sign in our hangar from "Bob O'Hara Honorary Hangar" to "Bob O'Hara Memorial Hangar"
  - Consider purchasing a brick or tile at Oshkosh to honor Bob
  - Support Tim Sullivan's efforts to raise money for a leukemia fund (Bob died of leukemia).
     This will be addressed in the Strobe and at the General Meeting.
- Scott Allen, a potential new member, has a Citabria and is looking for a hangar, or part of a hangar, for his aircraft. If you know of one, please contact us.

#### Jim Wilson – Vice President

- Ray Aviation Scholarship Andrew Gordon completed his application and has been awarded \$7,500 towards his Sport Pilot License. He will be training at the Foothill Flight Center in their Evektor LSA. Rules for the scholarship require that Andrew solo within 90 days, take his FAA written within 6 months, and take his check ride within one year. He plans to fly 2-3 times per week. The scholarship funds will be held by the Chapter; the initial payment will be for 40% of the total. Monthly progress reports need to be submitted.
- The flight simulator demo at Travis AFB in September may be cancelled due to COVID-19.

### Judi Gordon – Treasurer, Membership

- Banking account balances (from last month, update needed):
  - Cash and checks on hand: \$750.80
  - Chase Checking 6001: \$14,312.93 (of which \$5,705.70 is earmarked for scholarship funds)
  - Chase Savings 8668: \$2,922.06 (Airport security account held in trust. Not property of EAA 512)
  - Total as of 6/30/2020: \$15,063.73 plus \$2,922.06 in Airport Security Account.
  - We are expecting \$1,480 from Benevity.
- The Strobe currently reads "No General Meeting". Although we are not having a meeting at the hangar, we are having meetings. We will change the notice to read "Virtual General Meeting", or something similar.

- The hump in the pavers on the east side of the hangar is getting worse and is a trip hazard. We will address this shortly.
