The honorable Roy Wesley, USAF B52 Navigator, US Navy Reserve flying P3 Orion at Moffett Field, Bonanza pilot served as California's Inspector General. in Cameron Park. Our General Meeting and gathering, next week on 4/20/22 at the EAA 512 Hangar will start at 6 p.m. with a picnic, followed by the General Meeting and presentation at 7 p.m. The weather forecast is afternoon showers, so, plan on dressing warm and sitting indoors.

Our chapter motto is Aviate and Educate. In recent years, we have focused on aviation education for youth through our scholarship programs. Our main source of income is revenue generated from our pancake breakfasts.

Where do chapter funds go? In 2021, most of the money was allocated to our Sunny Atkins scholarship program. The chapter applied for and was accepted for two EAA National Ray Aviation Scholarships of \$10,000 each. In 2022, we opted into a 50/50 matching funds scholarship to support a new scholar.

Chapter Facility


Chapter 512 is blessed with a unique hangar, home, picnic grounds and garden that is the envy of many EAA chapters. We owe our gratitude to the chapter founders, Bob O'Hara, and many others for their foresight. The hangar was re-erected from an engine repair facility moved from Alameda Naval Air Station on San Francisco Bay. The foundation was poured and the ribs were erected and the hangar completed in 1978. Chapter members have strived to maintain and improve the facility over the years.

The most recent improvement was the new stair well to the loft and the reconstruction of a new and stronger stainless wire rope and post rail across the length of the loft and

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around the stairwell. With a new wood floor and casters added to office equipment and cabinets, the area can be cleaned with much greater ease. The next big project is the replacement of six skylights made of corrugated fiberglass panels (2x 8) on the east and west side of the hangar. Each skylight opening is 4 x 8 feet. After the panels are replaced with new panels to fill the 4 x 8 opening or a reduced 4 x 4 opening, the roof must be pressure washed and coated with a water-proof white seal.



The grandest project of all will be a new workshop constructed on the west side of the hangar dedicated to project workspace and education workshops. We call it Area 51.2 Annex. This space would contain our large tools and a tool crib with access through a door located in the middle of the west wall. We ask

chapter members to volunteer on a committee to develop a budget and plan the structure with the advice of a structural engineer.

The key to our success is the community spirit of fellow members and the camaraderie we enjoy. We welcome new members to our chapter and airport community. The only prerequisite is YOU LIKE AIRPLANES! So:

On April 2 we surprised and honored Jim Golding at Chapter 512's first pancake breakfast of the year. At 94 years old he was recognized with a Certificate of Honor for his World War II Veteran Status and being one of the oldest active licensed pilots in the United States. In 1945 he enlisted in the Navy as a combat crewman and tail gunner. His passion for aviation continued and he received his pilot's license in 1946. He is an active EAA Chapter 512 member. He is building an Osprey 2 in his garage and continues to fly often.



Board Member Reports

- O Jim Wilson President
 - Chapter recognition
 - Congratulations to chapter 512 in successfully reaching the **GOLD** level status recognition level for the combined 2020 and 2021 years.

■ Pancake Breakfast

- 4/2/22: The first pancake breakfast was a great success; possibly a new record.
 Increasing the price 33% from \$6 to \$8 helped. Dick had a great idea of acquiring \$2 bills which we used for change. This was a big hit!
 - o 125+ plates served; 18 planes flew in
 - o \$1,601 in gross income:
 - \$1,032 pancake breakfasts
 - \$140 gear sales
 - \$419 donations \$144 of the donations came from Jim Golding's celebration.

■ Ray Aviation Scholarship Status

- Jaeger Ruckman 2021 RAY SCHOLAR
 - o Passed his written test with 85% on 3/24. Total flight time as of 4/13, 39.4 hrs.
 - Ray Foundation has released the final \$2,000, which was deposited into our account on 4/11/22.
 - O The Board approved a motion to pay Great Planes, LLC \$430 for 4.3 hr. for March
 - Will Mathews invoiced the Chapter \$430 for 6.3 hr. of instruction.
- Aidan Andrews 2021 RAY SCHOLAR
 - Instruction began mid Nov at PVF. He flew 11.2 hrs. at PVF then moved to Cameron Park. He soloed in 26 hours meeting his deadline of 2/28. Hourly cost at Cameron Park has averaged \$179.50/hr.
 - O Total time as of April 8 is 32.1 hr.
 - He plans to take the FAA written exam in April.
 - Checkride is scheduled for 4/30/2022.

■ 2022 Ray Aviation Scholarship

- Chapter was awarded two 50/50 matching funds scholarships
 - O Chapter selected Ben Varrossa as the first scholar. Ray Foundation has released the first \$2,000, which was deposited into our account on 4/11/22.

- The second 50/50 is optional. We have until September to select a scholar for the October 31 deadline and raise the funds.

■ Sunny Atkins Scholarship

 - o Passed his checkride on 3/26/22 at 75 hours. First 30 hours at FFC.
 - Initial Sunny Atkins scholarship was \$1,500.
 - o On 2/27, Nathan requested additional funds from the Sunny Atkins Scholarship fund.
 - On 3/12, the Scholarship Committee voted to award Nathan an additional \$1,000.
 - The Board approved a motion to grant the \$1,000 to Nathan West from the Sunny Atkins Scholarship fund.




