From the chapter president





We now have many new EAA Chapter 517 members. It is time again to talk about EAA Chapter 517's "Fly The Big Sky" specialty license plate. The Chapter initiated this program in 2006 and since then we receive a check from the state each month at the rate of \$20 per plate sold or renewed. This income has allowed the Chapter to provide more scholarships each year than any other organization in the state. Of course, this income also helps support such things as Young Eagles and other youth and adult education events.

EAA 517 Chapter Meeting Schedule

Since 2002, when EAA Chapter 517 purchased our Stevensville chapter hangar, the Chapter has run a schedule of meetings where we split our meeting locations and alternated monthly meetings in Stevensville at the hangar and in Missoula usually at the MSO Airport conference room. For more than a year, it has frustrated the Board of Directors and Missoula area members that the meeting participation by Bitterroot members in our meetings has been minimal. Often, even in Stevensville, 10 to 12 Missoula members would show up with only one Bitterroot member showing up. As a result, the EAA 517 Board of Directors has made the decision to suspend the alternate meeting location schedule at least for the remainder of 2018. If we can generate interest and a commitment to participate by our southern members, we can re-examine the issue at our annual meeting in October.

Stevensville Hangar Status

The Chapter 517 Board of Directors has made the decision to offer the Stevensville hangar for sale or for a complete building lease. However, if we can get at least three full-time rental tenants we would suspend the sale or lease option.

This heated building is 65 feet by 48 feet. The hangar bay is 50 feet by 48 feet with an 11 feet 11 inch door and ceiling height. It has water, a restroom, and office space approximately 15 feet by 48 feet. There is also a large outside deck on the west side of the hangar.

The hangar is offered for sale at \$165,000 or an acceptable offer. It would cost over \$200,000 to build this hangar today with all its amenities. The chapter is willing to do owner financing with less than a normal bank down payment. We would be willing to lease the whole building for \$800 per month with a one year lease and month-to-month after that.

Having said that, if we can get at least two more member rental tenants, we would withdraw the sale and lease offer. The rental rate is \$200 per month per aircraft.

We may also have T-shirts and hats made up to sell. There will be two shifts each day for the booth.

We will need your help on these projects to generate income which will cover several months of our hangar mortgage. Let's not miss this wonderful opportunity to do great things for your chapter.

New Flying Club in Missoula

There is a new flying club in western Montana to be based in Missoula. The *Let's Fly Montana Flying Club* has been formed by several Missoula area pilots. The purpose of the club is to make extremely cost effective aircraft available for its members to fly. The members have decided that the first airplane to be acquired will be a Light Sport Aircraft (LSA). Initially, the cost to fly the airplane will be \$25 per hour dry. How many hours would you fly with a price like that?

The club members expect to have the first airplane by the end of May this year. A lot of interest has been expressed. So much so, that there may be a need for two aircraft right from the beginning. The club is targeting a members to aircraft ratio of 10 member for each airplane. This will help minimize scheduling conflicts.

Although a specific airplane has not yet been identified for the first purchase, it is expected that as the club grows, there will be a wide variety of aircraft available, not just LSAs. The members, at the time of a new purchase, will choose the next type aircraft to be brought.

Initially, some club members will loan the club the funds to buy the airplane. This will help keep membership fees as low as possible. Pay back to the members that provide the financing is expected to be in five years or less.

There are still first round memberships available. The cost to join the club will be \$500 until the first aircraft is purchased. Monthly dues will be less than \$100 per





month. This is a much better deal than even the cost of a hangar alone at the Missoula airport is \$300 per month, or more, for someone's own airplane.

There is still time to be included in the first round of membership,
