EAA CHAPTER 524 Excerpt from EAA's Sport Aviation Magazine, July 2024, pages 82-84.

Founded in 1975, EAA Chapter 524 is based in Frederick, Maryland. Since its formation, the chapter has had a long history of building and restoring airplanes. In the late 1980s and early '90s it hosted RV forums that featured presentations by Van's Aircraft founder Dick VanGrunsven, EAA Lifetime 3204. Over the years, the chapter has had a number of members who've received the Tony Bingelis Award and a few who've served on the EAA Homebuilt Aircraft Council. Chapter 524 has also hosted multiple SportAir Workshops over the years.

Like many chapters, Chapter 524 is active with Young Eagles flights and the Ray Aviation Scholarship program, and it's also associated with a local flying club that is restoring a Cessna 150M and building an RV-12. The chapter has hosted EAA's Ford Tri-Motor numerous times over the years as well as our B-17 Aluminum Overcast in 2014. Additionally, the chapter is in its third year of building a Zenith CH 750 to donate to a disabled veterans flying club.

With the amount of activities Chapter 524 is involved with, it's no surprise that it's been successful in drawing in folks from

around the area to the world of aviation.

"I think it's really nice to see people who don't usually hang out at the airport come out to things like the Airport



the Ford Tri-Motor and see the airplanes, hear about what we're doing," said Chris Gunther, EAA 711414, a former Chapter 524 president. "The little kids love it. We'll have people from all walks of life. It's a big farming community, and they'll see the planes flying overhead and wonder about them and come to check it out. We're close to [Washington] D.C., so we'll have retired pilots from the airlines come out, or military pilots come and reminisce about some of the vintage aircraft that we have."






