Mark P - I was fortunate enough to have my condition inspection due about the time we all went on lockdown. Shortly after that, I decided to do more or less a complete effort on all the things I had been thinking about doing with my RV-7A.

First was the condition inspection part; taking all the fairings/cowl/inspection panels/floorboards out to get a closer look. This is a great start on finding things like chaffing wires, worn tires and brake pads and lubricating/cleaning various control linkages. Installed new main gear tires.

One of my cowl flaps wasn't working; found the disconnected ground wire for that.

The plane power alternator Van's supplied has a less than stellar record for reliability, so decided to replace that with a B and C. That meant mounting and wiring an external voltage regulator. B and C has everything you need to make that no big deal, but working under the instrument panel on the cabin side of the firewall is not easy. Total cost for the alternator, regulator, installation kit and shipping was \$626. \$10 less than the Plane Power alone lists for.

Many of you have heard about my experiences with the Odyssey PC-680 battery. Trying to start my hi compression IO-360 was everything that battery could do, and in the winter it could just barely do it. After some research, decided to replace the Odyssey with a EarthX ETX-680 lithium. While a bit pricey at \$390, the numbers suggested this would start my motor much better, and the EarthX has built in thermal protection.

When you first receive the EarthX and pick up the box, you get the impression the box is empty! The battery weighs 4 lbs! The Odyssey weighs about 15 lbs; it is an amazing difference. No easier way to take 10+ pounds out of your airplane. But the biggest difference was when I went to start my engine after sitting for over 2 weeks. Blades swung by so fast, the next thing I knew it was running! Huge difference. It is not a drop-in replacement with the Odyssey. Slightly different dimensions. I bought the battery box from EarthX, another \$60. This was my best upgrade by far.

These guys I fly formation with finally talked me into installing a smoke system. Mass formation events want

you to have it. It's a good way to be able to judge your own aerobatics. Also good for showing your location to other aircraft. This installation took the longest, and was pretty involved.

I didn't like the idea of contributing more air pollution, but come to find out smoke oil is very thin mineral oil with minimal polluting effects. Now all I have to do is figure out a good way to clean the belly of the airplane!


I installed spring loaded hinges for my aft baggage compartment door and the top cowl oil check door.

Finally, I added firewall insulation for heat and noise.

All this took close to 3 weeks, doing about 4-5 hours each day. No better way to spend time during lockdown. What else was I going to do? Oh, and some beers with "social distanced" friends in other hangars for sanity...

I'm a lucky guy.

Another flyer to follow. See you all in the not so distant future, I hope!



# FREDERICK SPORT FLYERS RV-10 Progress Report



















Work continues on the RV-10, although at a much slower pace. Steve reports that the COVID RV-10 workforce has been effectively reduced to Steve.

Even with the greatly reduced workforce, progress is still measurable, and work continues every day. Milestones reached in the past month:

The Wings are in Steve's garage, and they get attended to for a couple of hours every evening. Recent developments include:

- Wing rough in wiring is complete
- The autopilot and trim services are installed, tested, and wired in
- The control rods are installed and calibrated to length
- The dreaded large bottom skins of the wings are riveted on
- All of the lights have been assembled (they were LED board kits) and tested
- Only the wing tips and the landing light cut-outs remain to be done

The Fuselage is sitting lonely and unattended most days. However, work still proceeds on Thursday evening and Saturday mornings. Recent progress includes:

- Completion of conduit installation and rough in wiring from tailcone to panel area
- Completion of antenna wire runs
- Installation of luggage area and passenger seat flooring panels
- Static lines have been run from the tailcone

Most importantly, the project team's shirts have arrived (Rachel, my daughter is modeling), for everyone on the build team.


Meeting called to order at 7:05 p.m.


