### Van's Aircraft Service Bulletin Reminder

Service Bulletin Number: 96-10-1

Synopsis: Affects users of Van's FAB-320 and FAB-360 filtered airboxes. Bolts attaching the top plate of the airbox to the carburetor may come loose and be ingested in the engine, possibly causing severe damage.

Correction: The four bolts used to fasten the VA-130C (FAB-320) or VA-131C (FAB-360) to the carburetor must be safetied. This may be accomplished by either using bolts with drilled heads and safety wiring them in pairs, or by installing tab lock washers under the bolt heads. If the tab lock washers are used, a 1/8" hole must be drilled in the top plate for the tab that prevents the washer from rotating. After the bolt is installed, an ear of the washer is bent up against one flat of the bolt heat, preventing the bolt from moving.

Raegan has been busy with various RV inspections and is concerned that owners may overlook this old bulletin item. It applies to all RV's except RV 12 & RV 14.

"It states that the 4 bolts connecting the air box (top platelet) to the carburetor can come loose and get ingested (consumed) into the engine. To fix it, add safety wire or tab washers. Please check on these fairly regularly."

### **Board Meeting**

09 Jan 2025

Meeting called to order at 7:07 pm by Bob Miller

- ★ Bob shared that Dean Stickell's wife passed away in December. They're holding a celebration of life on Friday, Jan 31 at 11 a.m. at the Frederick Church of the Brethren, 201 Fairview Ave, Frederick, MD 21701. The Chapter is welcome to come.
- ★ Bob wanted to check in to see if the Board wanted to consider any changes to the budget. Rent is \$272/month for the hangar. Member dues don't cover expenses for the year, but projects and other fundraisers help offset operating costs for the year. We currently have about \$50,000 in the bank. \$20,000 belongs to veterans build (\$12,500 was just given for instrument panel). \$10,000 is scholarship fund. Half of the 50/50 raffle is also assigned to scholarship fund. Most of the \$20,000 surplus money in the bank is a result of the sale of the Rans. Christmas wrapping brought in over \$1,000. Festival of Flight also brought in funds.
- ★ In the past, banquet tickets have been expensive, but we still lose money for the event. We're currently looking at dates in April.
- $\bigstar$  Steve suggested quarterly fly-outs as "dollar neutral" ways to get the Chapter together.
- ★ Bob asked if we wanted to start using CashApp/Venmo/Zelle and other digital forms of payment. We lost out on money at the Festival of Flight and gift wrapping fundraiser. Steve will do some research on ways to take digital payments and report back next month.
- ★ Bob brought up the PA-12 again. We need to rescue it from its current location and decide what will be done with it. Ernie suggested we wait until the weather improves to retrieve it; in the meantime, we need to decide where we're going to store it. Once the Zodiac and RV-12 and other projects are done, we can start inspecting/doing inventory on the PA-12. When we know what we have and the condition, we can advertise it as a restoration project. Steve may have space in his hangar at Keymar to store the PA-12.
- ★ EAA offered us the Trimotor October 10-12. We will reply in the affirmative.

### **Chapter History from John Baker Archives**



johnt.baker Back to 1989 when John Beers was flying his highly modified Bakeng Deuce. He was a longtime member of EAA Chapter 524 in Frederick, Maryland. John, who passed away years ago, was a classic EAA homebuilder, long before the era of "fast build" kits. Scratch built in his garage in Silver Spring, Maryland, John incorporated numerous changes to the original design. He changed the shape of the tail surfaces and turtle deck to suit his tastes. He built a two place fiberglass engine cowling of his own design. Most significant was the landing gear modification. In place of the standard spring steel gear, John designed and built an outrigger gear that incorporated Aeronca oleo struts. John called the plane "Mina's Goose," in honor of Mina Paille, the legendary owner of Davis Airport (W50) in Laytonsville Maryland. On my 40th birthday, I was hanging out at the airport, completing an oil change on the Stinson. Sukey contrived for me to go flying in the "Goose" with my friend Jack Roberts. We ended up at College Park Airport (CGS) where Jack suggested we get a cool drink at the 94th Aero Squadron Restaurant on the field. Once inside, I was surprised by about 40 friends and family members. What a day, #airplanesarecool #eaa #bakengduece #eaa524




