

Important General Aviation Issues Discussed During FAA Safety

March 22, 2023

During the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Safety Summit, held on March 15, general aviation (GA) industry leaders participated both in the opening public session and later, in a closed-door breakout session to discuss current challenges and improvements needed to enhance the safety of GA operations.

The public session was opened by Department of Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg, FAA Acting Administrator Billy Nolen, and National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) Chair Jennifer Homendy. National Business Aviation Association (NBAA) President and CEO Ed Bolen and other industry leaders then participated in a panel discussion, led by former NTSB Chair Robert Sumwalt and Acting Administrator Nolen. During this discussion, Bolen emphasized that GA, which is a vital link in our nation's transportation system and economy, is the primary training ground for pilots and technicians...

New Parts Program Big Win for Vintage Fleet

Thanks to years of EAA's advocacy efforts, the FAA has unveiled a new program for the use of off-the-shelf parts in type-certificated aircraft. This is the first approval granted under the new Vintage Aircraft Replacement and Modification Article (VARMA) program, the next big step in keeping vintage aircraft flying.

Ultralight/Homebuilt Rotorcraft Pattern Altered Slightly for AirVenture

April 6, 2023

Due to expansion of aircraft parking at the south end of Wittman Regional Airport, the ultralight/homebuilt rotorcraft flight pattern for EAA AirVenture Oshkosh has been slightly altered for 2023. The changes will create a more standard pattern for those using the Fun Fly Zone airstrip, home for ultralights, homebuilt rotorcraft, light planes, balloons, and the Twilight Flight Fest.

The new pattern will maintain its parallel course with County Highway N, but will then make a northeast turn toward the airport and Wittman Road. That replaces the hard north turn followed by an east turn prior to reaching Wittman Road. The remainder of the pattern will remain the same. . . .





- ◆ Meeting called to order at 7:02 pm by Chris Gunther
- ◆ ERAU Daytona has shown interest in the Lycoming O-235 engine. We hope to sell it as a fundraiser for the Chapter. The thought is that it was initially donated for Veterans Build, but they've since opted to go with O-200. The board will establish ownership within the Chapter to see where funds would go once sold.
- → Terry has been distributing posters to different airports and still looking for donations. Has verbal commitment for sponsorships. Keymar Airpark was just sold and one of the new owners is on TV in the Baltimore area (WBAL-11)

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Prior to Kreider Reisner Aircraft Co. (KR) building their own airplanes they purchased, repaired, and sold used aircraft throughout the north east. Their facility was made up of a small group of buildings on the 800 block of Pennsylvania Avenue, just north of downtown Hagerstown.

By 1925, KR had acquired a great reputation as an aircraft repair station and used aircraft dealer, and decided it was time to venture into selling new aircraft. That same year they acquired the distributorship for the Waco Aircraft Co., and began to sell the Waco 9 and later the Waco 10 biplanes with great success.

This is a very rare photograph from the collection of Theron Rinehart that dates from 1925. It shows four Waco 9 biplanes on the grass runway directly behind the group of buildings that KR occupied for their repair business. The runway and buildings were located on the site where in 1929 KR and Fairchild built what became Plant 1. This building survives to this day.

The "Little Green Shed", was one of the main buildings used by KR for both repair and then manufacturing. It can be seen directly behind the first airplane. This building was dismantled, and is in the museum's collection. It will be used in a future display.
