President's Message

I hope this newsletter finds everyone safe and sound. While I would prefer to talk about a hundred different things, the elephant in the room continues to be the COVID-19 pandemic. Maryland and the region are slowly opening up to more activity. As of this writing, Maryland in general is in phase 2, which means the indoor restaurants and outdoor pools are able to open at 50% capacity and outdoor activities like miniature golf are available again. Some flight training has quietly resumed at Frederick and other local airports. This is a good sign, but it is also tempered with increased infection rates from states like Texas that resumed some activities ahead of Maryland. Baltimore is still in phase 1 and recently saw an 8% increase in hospitalizations due to the virus.

What does that mean for the chapter? We will still have the RV-10 workshops at the reduced capacity and sign-up process for people in relatively lower risk groups to attend. For the banquet, the board is looking to do an outdoor catered picnic near the Chapter Hangar. Hopefully we will be able to use and support the Airways Inn, our favorite hang-out spot during quieted times. We believe this will be a low risk way to get together again.

EAA will be hosting a variety of on-line session during the week when Airventure normally takes place (July 21-25). Please see eaatogether.org for details.

Stay safe and if you do have some progress to report on your latest aviation project, please let Mary Ann know so she can share it with the Chapter members. Flying alone in your plane counts as socially distancing, so if you have recent adventures in the air, please let us know as well.

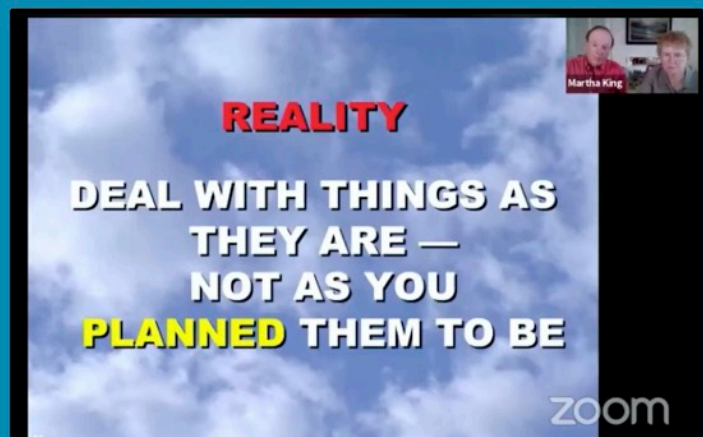
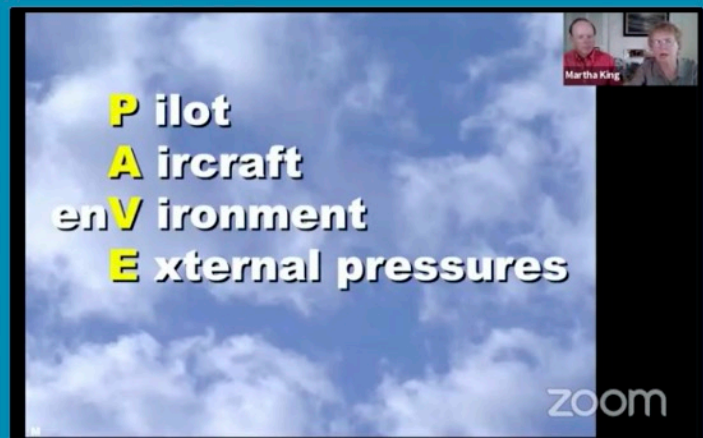


June Presentation

“For our June meeting, we started early with a zoom meeting of our own to cover chapter business, progress reports and latest developments. After that, we convened so we could join another zoom meeting given by John and Martha King of King Aviation Schools. The Kings have a great deal of aviation experience flying all over the world and currently fly their own Falcon 10. You can find their presentation archived on the Smokehouse Pilots Club Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/gabriel.muller.391/videos/1664706457031069/>). The Power Point presentation begins roughly 23 minutes into the video.

One of the highlights was an early experience of theirs flying a Centurion with alternator failure. Being VFR on top, they proceeded with the master off, believing their battery could be used for the descent/landing. Over their destination, they turned the battery back on to find it completely dead. With no alternatives, they made a harrowing blind descent, ending up in a cornfield. They were lucky to survive and learned some important lessons! Thanks to the Kings and to Gabe Muller and the Smokehouse Pilots Club for letting us piggy-back on their presentation.”

EAA AVIATION CENTER, OSHKOSH, Wisconsin – (June 5, 2020) – The Experimental Aircraft Association is showcasing the whole spectrum of flight this summer in a virtual way, as EAA Spirit of Aviation Week on July 21-25 will celebrate the entire aviation community.

The five-day event will include streamed and on-demand content, encompassing nearly every subset of aviation, with a focus on educational, informational, and entertaining content. EAA's special interest groups will also be heavily involved, bringing highlights that include homebuilts, warbirds, vintage, aerobatics, ultralights, and much more.

"Nothing can replace the Oshkosh experience in-person during AirVenture week, as that event personifies the common passion we have for flight, in all its wonderful ways," said Jack J. Pelton, EAA's CEO and chairman of the board. "As unfortunate as it was that the cancellation of AirVenture 2020 took away that personal experience, countless people and groups have stepped forward to ask what they could do to virtually create something from Oshkosh that brings us together as aviators and aviation enthusiasts. We're going to incorporate as many of them as possible during a full five-day event."

Among the highlights already planned for EAA Spirit of Aviation Week are:

- Presentations, forums, and discussions with notable leaders in aviation
- Historical and archival content that highlights aviation legends
- Homebuilding workshops, discussions, and educational tips
- Content centered on pilot proficiency and learning to fly
- A virtual exhibit space that showcases products, show specials, videos, and services available from the hundreds of AirVenture exhibitors.
- Features from air show performers to military and space programs
- Stories from those in EAA's community through Hangar Flying segments

[EAAtogether.org](https://www.eaa.org) will be the exclusive home of the entire five-day event. The schedule is expected to launch in the coming weeks before the virtual opening day, under the theme and hashtag #EAAtogether.

"The people of EAA make The Spirit of Aviation and that's what we're celebrating these five days," Pelton said. "All we're missing are tents and campfire aroma, but perhaps that's something you and your EAA chapter can add wherever you are with your local aviation family."

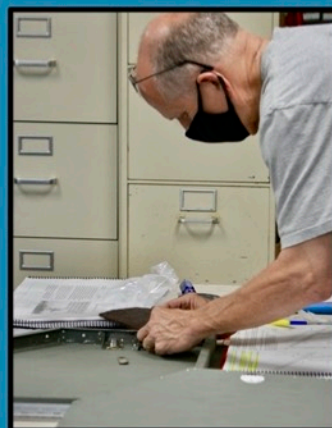
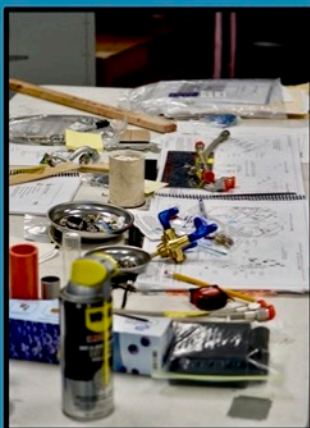


Work continues on the RV-10

- Mark Pankratz – banquet is still set for July 18, but we’re waiting to see if the Red Horse will be open and if the room will be available; depends on coronavirus guidelines. Event is 6:00 – 9:00 p.m., dinner will be at 6:30.
- Rex Bullinger – Sport Air Workshop; EAA is trying to figure out a game plan, so we’re waiting for Mark Forss to give word on what’s going to happen.

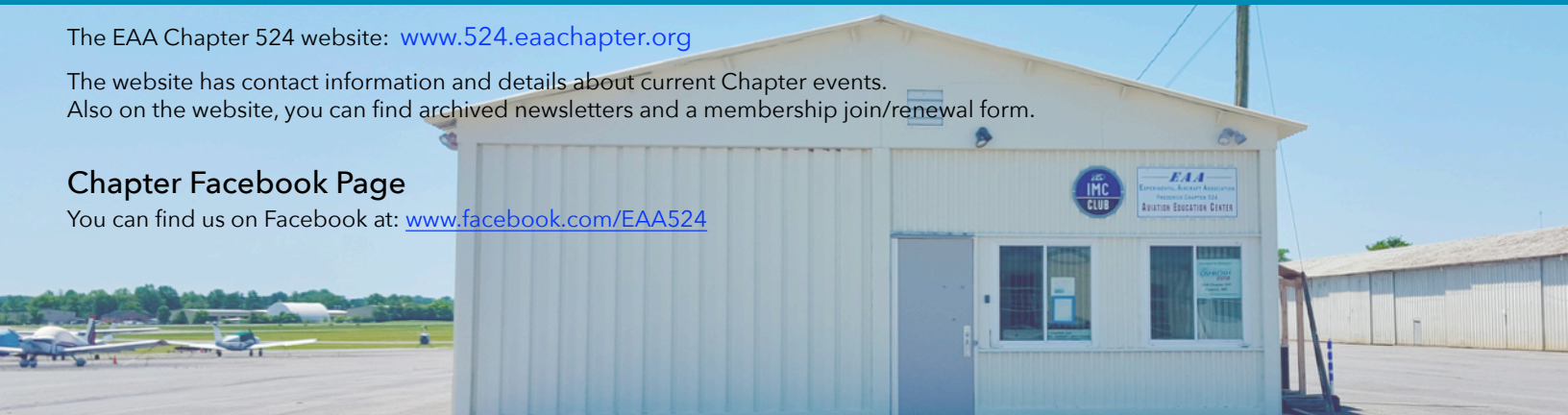
