Leesburg Airport's Remote Tower Gets Its Own Space

An agreement between the town and Loudoun County has been reached to house the municipal airport's remote tower. The Town Council approved a lease agreement at its meeting earlier this week. The Board of Supervisors recently approved the lease of unoccupied office space, and a waiver of the rent, for 1,635 square feet at 748-750 Miller Drive. The Leesburg Airport remote tower came about through a partnership with the town, Saab Sensis Corporation, the Virginia SATS Lab, and the Federal Aviation Administration Office of NextGen. The first airport in the nation to use the technology, the remote tower system places cameras and other equipment all around the airport, but rather than construct an actual tower, air traffic controllers can work in any space, even off airport property. Currently, the remote tower is housed in a Leesburg Airport conference room . . .

FAA Plans to Close Remote Tower at Leesburg Airport

A notification from the Federal Aviation Administration that it plans to end the remote air traffic control tower program at Leesburg Executive Airport in June has town leaders scrambling for ways to keep the safety service going.

Since 2015, the airport has been a testing ground for a remote tower system developed by Saab Inc. that uses high-definition cameras and displays, maneuverable optical and infrared cameras, microphones, and a signal-light-gun to provide data to air traffic controllers at a remote tower center located just outside airport property on Miller Drive. Controllers used the system to direct aircraft movements and space in the air and on the airport grounds. The remote technology is an alternative to building a brick-and-mortar air traffic control tower at the airport . . .

In Memory of Neil Wright 1932-2023

Gone West

I first met long time EAA and Chapter 524 member Neil Wright in the Fall of 1980 when he enrolled as a student in the Frederick Community College Aviation Maintenance Technology Program where I was on the faculty. Neil had just retired, was a Bonanza owner, and had his own grass strip on his farm near Hagerstown. He was a welcome bit of maturity and graduated with an FAA Airplane and Powerplant Certificate with the class of 1982. Shortly thereafter, in the middle of the next semester, I was appointed the Program Manager and was in desperate need of a new faculty member. On a Friday, after classes, I called Neil on the phone and without any small talk said, "can you come to work Monday morning." After a slight pause, "Neil said, sure." And there began Neil's nineteen year distinguished second career with Frederick Community College.

Neil became a trusted teacher, mentor, and father confessor to all of his students. He put together a first class Reciprocating Engine Overhaul Course and was completely responsible for developing and implementing a Composite Structures Course that far exceeded FAA requirements.

To complement his A & P Certification Neil added Inspection Authorization and became an FAA Designated Mechanic Examiner.

Neil owned and flew several types of airplanes in his lifetime but his first love was his Bonanza that he owned for more than thirty years. When he finally sold it, it was like losing a family member especially when a week later the new owner ran it out of gas and cracked it up.

02 Mar 2023


Meeting called to order at 7:06 pm by Chris Gunther

Hagerstown Aviation Museum

The urgent need for the Fairchild PT-19 Primary Training airplane at the beginning of World War II required that the company partner with local, non-aircraft related companies, and utilize warehouse space to meet the demand.

Fairchild management devised a plan that became known as the "Hagerstown System". Under this plan, Fairchild subcontracted with local businesses throughout Hagerstown and the surrounding area to produce parts, pieces, and components of aircraft that would then be transported to the main factory for final assembly and flight testing.

This plan worked exceptionally well throughout the war, and was initially seen as a stop-gap measure to allow the time for Fairchild to build the necessary floor space. However, as a testament to its success, relationships which had been developed and honed during the war continued in a significant measure even after the conflict came to an end.

This collection of photos shows production at Fairchild's largest subcontractor, the Moller Pipe Organ Co. Moller produced complete wings and center sections for the PT-19 "Cornell" primary training airplane, the UC-61 "Forwarder" liaison airplane (military version of the model 24), and clam shell doors for the prototype C-82 "Packet" cargo airplane.


