- Mark G. reminded the Chapter that \$30 membership dues are due in January. Money/checks can be given to Ernie.
- Mark P. reported that the banquet venue could change depending on the size of the expected crowd. It could possibly be held at the Red Horse, or Dutch's daughter. The possible dates are March 14 or March 21. The presentation for the evening will focus on the Cub project and will celebrate the remarkable achievement.
- Mark and Mary went to see the silent film "Wings" at the Weinberg Center and had a wonderful time.

Cub Progress Report

Saturday, 07 December - Today was moving day. The Cub was moved into its own hangar next door and Steve's RV-10 project moved into the chapter hangar. The biggest puzzle was how to fit the Cub in with Joe's Challenger in the Cub hangar. We moved a lot of things around in the hangar and tried several different ways to fit the two together. Part of the solution we settled on involved removing the tail feathers from the Challenger. Once that was done we were able to get both planes in, but the arrangement is still not ideal. To get the Cub out it will be necessary to move the Challenger out first. Joe is looking into finding hangar space at a grass field more appropriate for the Challenger such as nearby Keymar. The Cub is still waiting on a tach, a couple of placards, and some log book sign-offs. Once that is done it will be time for first flight. Exciting times.

Meanwhile, the RV-10 project was moved in and organized. The fuselage cabin area is a complete quick build kit. The tail cone is mostly finished as well. An attempt was made to mate the two, but fitting proved difficult, so it was decided to put that off until later. The schedule for the new RV-10 project will be a little different from our Cub schedule. Steve is not available weekdays, so we are going to work Saturdays and Wednesday mornings around 9:00.

Steve is hoping to put out periodic notices to the chapter concerning upcoming tasks on the project. As with the Cub, all chapter members are welcome to come participate and learn.

RV-10 Project Begins

Thursday,12 December - RV-10 project officially got underway with a session devoted to organization. After a short briefing by Steve, we divided tasks among us and got to work. Tools were inventoried and compared to a list of tools required for the project provided by Vans. Between what the Chapter owns and tools Steve brought in, we already have almost everything needed. The hardware and small parts kits were compared to a Vans inventory list. There, we ran into a problem as most of the bag numbers did not match the list. After a little research Steve discovered the correct list on line.

A collection of larger parts was sorted according to whether they belonged to the fuselage or the wings. Steve is working on finishing the wings elsewhere, so the wing parts are going home with him. Once that was done, Richard and Lew started comparing the fuselage plans to the fuselage to determine what had already been completed in the quick build kit versus what still needed to be done.

A set of hardware cabinets was also secured to the wall and labels applied to the drawers.

Work will continue on Saturday, December 14th at 9:00 am.

Saturday Work Session

Saturday, 14 December - Today was a combination of prep work for the RV-10, getting the O-235 engine ready for shipping, and log book sign-offs for the Cub.

Dick Fox came and sat down with Jerry to go through the Cub logs and sign everything off. In preparation for that, Jerry made up an impressive detailed listing of everything that we did in the course of the restoration. By contrast, there is a Cub logbook entry from the 1950's that simply says, "Recovered Ship." The Cub is now officially ready to fly except for the missing tach.

Meanwhile, the RV-10 project moved closer to actual building as parts were inventoried, sorted, and hardware put into labelled bins. Some work on that remains to be done. An extension cord was also routed to the new large tool cabinet which includes a power strip for recharging batteries. Raegan and Mark did some preliminary reviewing of the plans, while Mash and Mary assembled a stand for hanging small parts for priming.

The O-235 engine also got some attention. The accessory case was prepared for shipping and a crate was finished for it and the crankcase. Chris took some of the smaller parts for cleaning to the shop at John's Hopkins.

The next work session will be Wednesday, December 18th at 9:00 am.
