EAA 533 Board Meeting August 5th, 2020

Meeting called to order at 7:12PM by Vice-President Brian Jones. Brian Jones read the minutes of the previous meeting. Upon motion of David Javarey, second by Stephen Thomas, and vote, the minutes were approved as read.

Treasurer's Report presented by John Flanagan.

EAA 533 will be receiving the next installment of the **Ray Scholarship** money from EAA National: \$6,000.00.

July disbursements: \$589.00 renters insurance, \$3,416.50 instruction and aircraft rental.

To date, a total of \$4,249.50 has been paid for scholarship recipient Lucas Pratt's training. Lucas soloed on July 18th. Ray Scholarship monies are not included in the Treasurer's Report above. Upon motion of David Javarey, second by Andrea Muller-Hoff and vote, the report was accepted as presented.

Cessna 140 - Status: Sharon Kaiser said the plane is flying well. David Javarey reported that he will be getting replacements for the gas caps.

J-3 Cub - Status: David Javarey said that he is still waiting for the tach cable replacement.

Hovercraft/Project Night update: John Flanagan ordered the material to make the skirt for the

hovercraft. The lift fan is mounted on the shaft. Upcoming: foaming the lift duct. John said Harbor Freight has a 23 HP engine that has a horizontal shaft, needed for a belt-driven prop. Discussion followed on engine options, which included using a snowmobile engine. Members will keep their eye out for prospects.

New Members, hangar access requests: Sharon Kaiser reported nothing new in the last month.

Pancake Breakfasts - after discussion, there will be no public breakfast held in September. The possibility of a breakfast in October will be discussed at the next board meeting.

Miscellaneous Items

The lease between The County of Chemung and EAA 533 will terminate on April 30, 2021. This is the end of the twenty-five year lease agreement. EAA 533 will begin to address the issues for the re-letting of the premises.

Sharon Kaiser presented an email she received from former member Jim Allen regarding a meeting to ascertain interest from local pilots to form an

association to manage the Kayuta Lake Airport (2NY9). The meeting will be held August 15th. Andrea Muller-Hoff will put the notice on the website.

Website - Andrea Muller-Hoff is continuing to work on the site.

Dave Baker asked about reviewing the Hangar Tenant Agreement. There are members who are on the waiting list to get their projects into the hangar, including board member Mike Taveniku. Discussion followed. Brian Jones suggested sending letters to tenants regarding the Project/Aircraft Review, as stipulated in the Agreement. Dick Welles recommended that the Hangar Committee consist of three people. There currently are two, following the death of Wes McKinney, who was a permanent member of the Committee. Andrea Muller-Hoff asked if some projects and/or flying aircraft could temporarily relocate for short-term work. Dave Baker asked about the possibility of using the storage building at the former Wings of Eagles site. Brian Jones will call Jim Suggs about setting up a meeting, including tenants and those on the waiting list, in September. Stephen Thomas asked about procedure to the get the third member of the Hangar Committee. It will be discussed at the September board meeting, but current consensus favored a board appointment.

There being no further business, upon motion of Andrea Muller-Hoff, second by Mike Taveniku, and vote, meeting adjourned at 8:30PM.


Chapter Activities (All dates and times subject to change)
