EAA 533 Board of Directors Meeting Minutes for January 2nd, 2019

Meeting called to order by President Jim Suggs at 7:05PM. Guest Chris Hickok was welcomed. Chris is a new pilot, and interested in learning more about aviation. Andrea Muller-Hoff read the minutes of the previous board meeting. Upon motion of David Javarey, second by Stephen Thomas, and vote, the minutes were approved as read.

John Flanagan presented the Treasurer's Report: Expenditures in the past month included \$790.00 for the Chapter Renewal and \$372.00 for fire extinguishers.

Upon motion of Andrea Muller-Hoff, second by Stephen Thomas, and vote, the treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

Cessna 140 - Status: No change from last month's report.

J-3 Cub – Status: No change from last month's report.

Hovercraft – Update: John Flanagan noted the last session was a clean up in a section of the hangar.

New members, hangar access requests: Sharon Kaiser presented a new membership application from Garry Benesh, member Burt McConnell's son-in-law. Garry has been helping with the hovercraft. He is a retired small engines instructor for NYS DOC. Upon motion of Jim Suggs, second by Lou Kossler, and vote, Garry's application was approved.

2019 Events – Jim Suggs opened the discussion for 2019 planning. EAA 533 will hold another car show in August. The WINGS program, cancelled due to weather last November, will be rescheduled. The monthly breakfasts will be held the first Sunday of the month, June through October. Jim also commented that the airport will be getting a new manager. Sharon Kaiser asked if the chapter will be hosting a Young Eagles event for the Cub Scouts. David Javarey said he knows a local scout leader, and will make an inquiry about an event. Stephen Thomas asked if Jon Meigs will continue as the Young Eagles Coordinator. Jim Suggs thought he would.

It is our understanding that the RV group will return for another rally, in the fall.

It was suggested that EAA 533 partner with local groups, to promote aviation in the community. Our mission statement is: promoting aviation through education and community service. Chris Marble commented that the local BOCES has an aeronautical syllabus, which is a potential resource. Lou Kossler has a contact with BOCES, and will follow up on it.

Miscellaneous Items: Stephen Thomas said there were some changes in the offer from United Fire Equipment, but we now have three CO2 units in the hangar: two 20 pound

units and one 15 pound unit; and a dry chemical unit in the clubroom.

Wes Sign for the hangar: David Javarey will contact Rob Reynolds after the holidays.

Ford Tri-Motor fund raiser: Jim Suggs said EAA national is looking to the chapters to raise \$160,000, toward the million dollar project. It was suggested that the board modify our matching offer. After discussion, Jim Suggs moved that EAA 533 will match individual donations to the Ford Tri-Motor fund raiser, up to a \$1,000 total match. Brian Jones seconded the motion, and upon vote, motion carried.

Sharon Kaiser noted that EAA 533 received a \$100 donation to the chapter, from a renewing member.

There being no further business, upon motion of Brian Jones, second by Stephen Thomas, and vote, the meeting was adjourned at 7:40PM.


Members Calendar (All dates and times subject to change)
