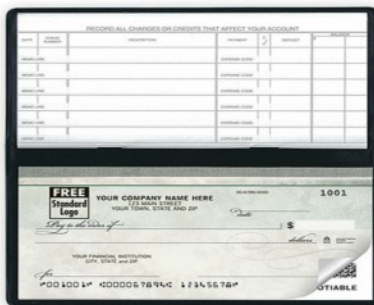

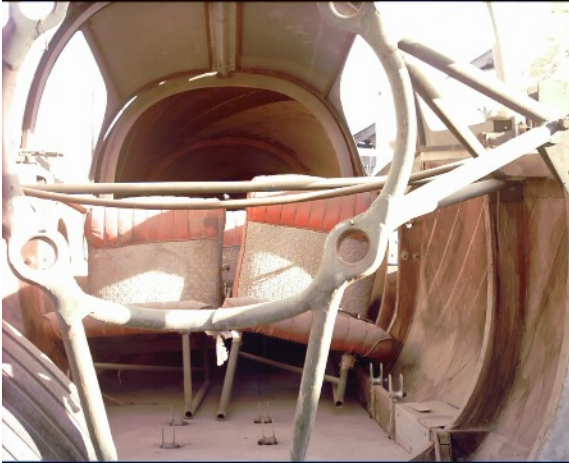

About Taylor



Taylor lies in a broad valley in east-central Arizona at an elevation of 5,640 feet with the Mogollon Rim to its west and the White Mountains to the south. The mountains form an almost continuous barrier protecting Taylor from severe winters and creating a semi-arid climate. The Town of Taylor, named after John Taylor, the third president of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, was settled by James Pearce in 1878 and later incorporated in 1966. Taylor Town Logo: Drum & Anvil- The logo represents two family traditions that have grown to include the whole town. First is the Standiford family tradition of *"The Firing of the Anvil"* every 4th of July at 4:00 a.m. with a loud BANG! After that there is a serenade of patriotic music from the Jennings Band. This awakening call goes on as the anvil is fired in different locations around town. This unique tradition began with the Taylor Pioneers, was revived in 1953, and continues still, drawing people home throughout the U.S.A.

Jennings Drum- The historical drum, constructed by Major Edward Duzette, was made of cowhide, birch, and hickory and used in the Nauvoo Legion Band in the 1830's. It was hauled across the plains on the back of Brigham Young's carriage with the first company of Mormon pioneers in 1847 and later given to Cyrus Jennings, hence it is known as the Jennings drum.



The Anvil- The heavy duty anvil was used by the Mormon Battalion in 1847. It was later brought to Taylor by Joseph S. Hancock in the late 1800's to be used in his blacksmith shop. In the late 19th century, Taylor's forefathers came up with the idea of "firing" it as a substitution for the cannon &

fireworks.

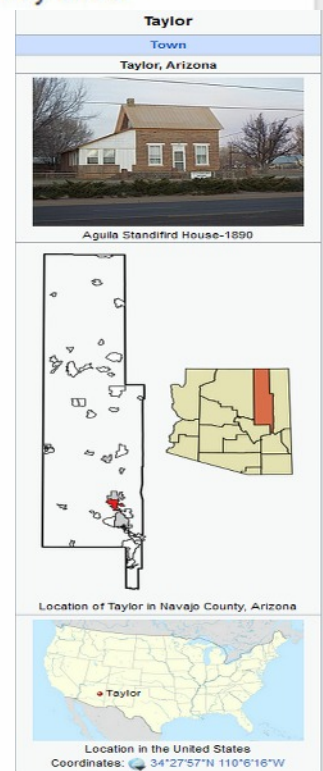

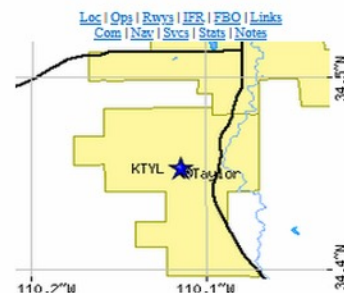

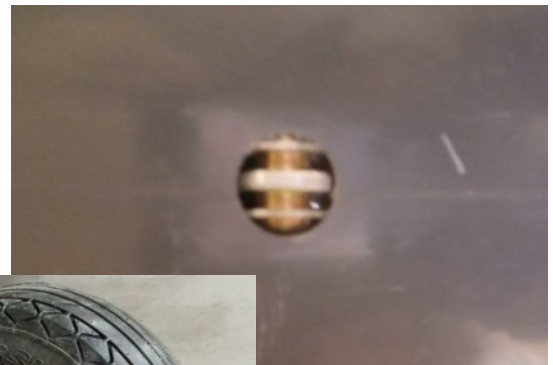
I finished the Tail Fairing cutting and fitting - including drilling a 3/4 inch hole on the bottom, even though it was not obvious what it was for. All the clearances were good, until I ran the trim motor to full extension. Then a joint in the trim linkage protrudes from the hole on the bottom by maybe 1/8 inch! See (fuzzy) picture. I have to assume this was an issue discovered in the late development or early kit deliveries. It would not have been hard to change the fairing profile to accommodate that inside the fairing. Anyhow as you might expect, the clearance around the linkage is not the required 1/8 inch - so the @\$!@#~% thing will have to come off yet one more time for trimming.

Then I "calibrated" the float gauge in the fuel tank. I filled it with 20 gallons of water, one gallon at a time & took pictures of the gauge each gallon. The picture is of the gauge with the tank full. looks like there is less than a gallon of "dead" (no needle travel) at each end of the scale. Than drained the tank. it should be completely dry by the time I get the fuel pumps to attach. (they come with the engine kit)

I also built up the wheels and brakes on the gear legs. The attachment fittings to hold the legs to the fuselage are on back order, so all I could do was the re-position the fuselage on a table high enough to allow the legs to clear the ground as they are attached. I left the brake line from the legs to the brake calipers off jut to avoid damage as I install the legs. The legs are heavy and the wheels and tires are not light.

I also got a ship notification from flight line interiors, who are doing the seats and interior coverings. Another nice part of the E-SLA process is that the requirement to build it in conformity with the S-LSA means that they need to provide as kit with virtually everything. All I had to do was pick colors and write the check for the options I chose. No need to fins a vendor of worry about getting measurements right etc. Should have pictures next month.

Vans indicates the back order parts should be available to ship about DEC 15, so hopefully I will be back at it soon.
