EAA Chapter 538 Monthly Meeting Minutes for June 14, 2022

01. Meeting was called to order at 6:35 P.M..
02. Twenty-five members and two visitors were in attendance. The visitors were Eric and Jennifer Lintz.
03. Darren let the visitors give a self introduction.
04. Our speaker J.K. Wright from Commemorative Air Force Museum Falcon Field Airport (MSC) 2017 N Greenfield Rd, Mesa, AZ 85215 Phone (480) 924-1940. It is a nonprofit that gives airplane rides in WWII airplanes. Their B-17 has a picture of Betty Grable on it looking backwards. At the time she was pregnant. He gave a brief history of the Airlines that flew from Falcon Field. They also own, a C-47 transport plane. CAF flies about 120 historic airplanes nationwide. Here in Arizona there were 59 airfields dedicated to pilot training. Luke Air Force base is named after the WW1 pilot Frank Luke Jr of Phoenix, AZ. He flew for 17 hours, had 18 confirmed kills before being shot down himself. Falcon field was a training field in 1941. They trained P51 and B-17 pilots for both the US and England. It was a 28 week course. Pilots started in the Stearman Vulture BT13 & Texan T6. There is a cemetery for the 23 pilot who lost their lives during training. After the war, 20th Century Fox donated money to use and update the field for a picture they were shooting.
05. We took a break at 7:38 P.M. YOU NEED TO RSVP to Darren or Cheri.
06. It was announced that we rejected a \$528,000 bid to construct the hangar.
07. The Tuskegee Airman have invited out members to a meet and greet at the Arrowhead Country Club on August 9th. From 6:00 until 9:00 P.M. This is a member's only event. If you have not paid your yearly dues do so quickly. The address is 19888 N. 73rd, Glendale, AZ 85308.
08. John Gregg gave his Treasurer report. We have \$118,500. in the bank. We have about 100 members. Some of whom have not paid their dues. John will be notifying them.

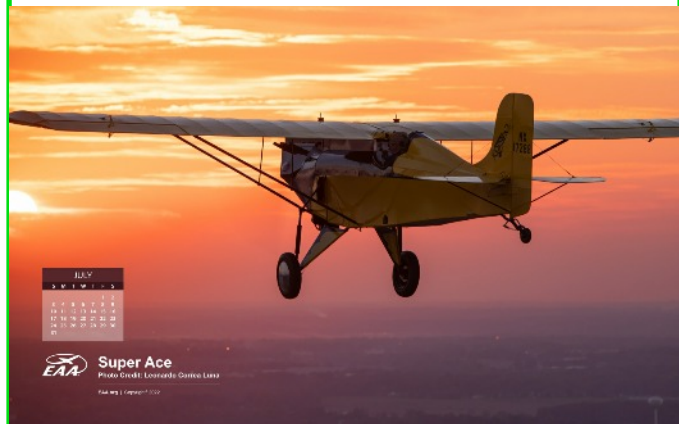

In 2011, a 14-member Midwest flying club needed to decide what to do about its 1997 Cessna 172R whose Lycoming IO-360 engine had reached its 2,000-hour TBO. The club turned to its maintenance officer for advice, and he turned to Mike Busch's company Savvy Aviation. 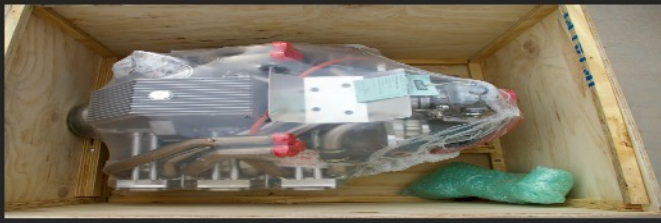

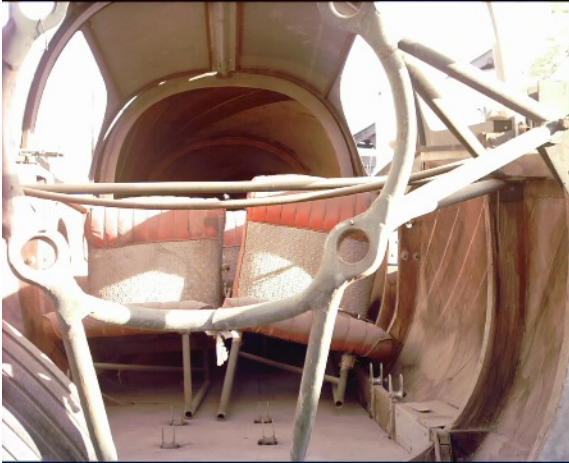

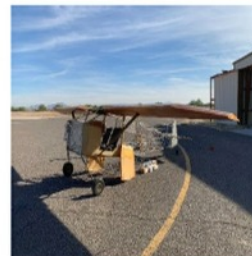

Bisbee is a town in Cochise County, Arizona, USA, 92 miles (148 km) southeast of Tucson. According to the 2010 census, the population of the town was 5,575. The town is the county seat of Cochise County.

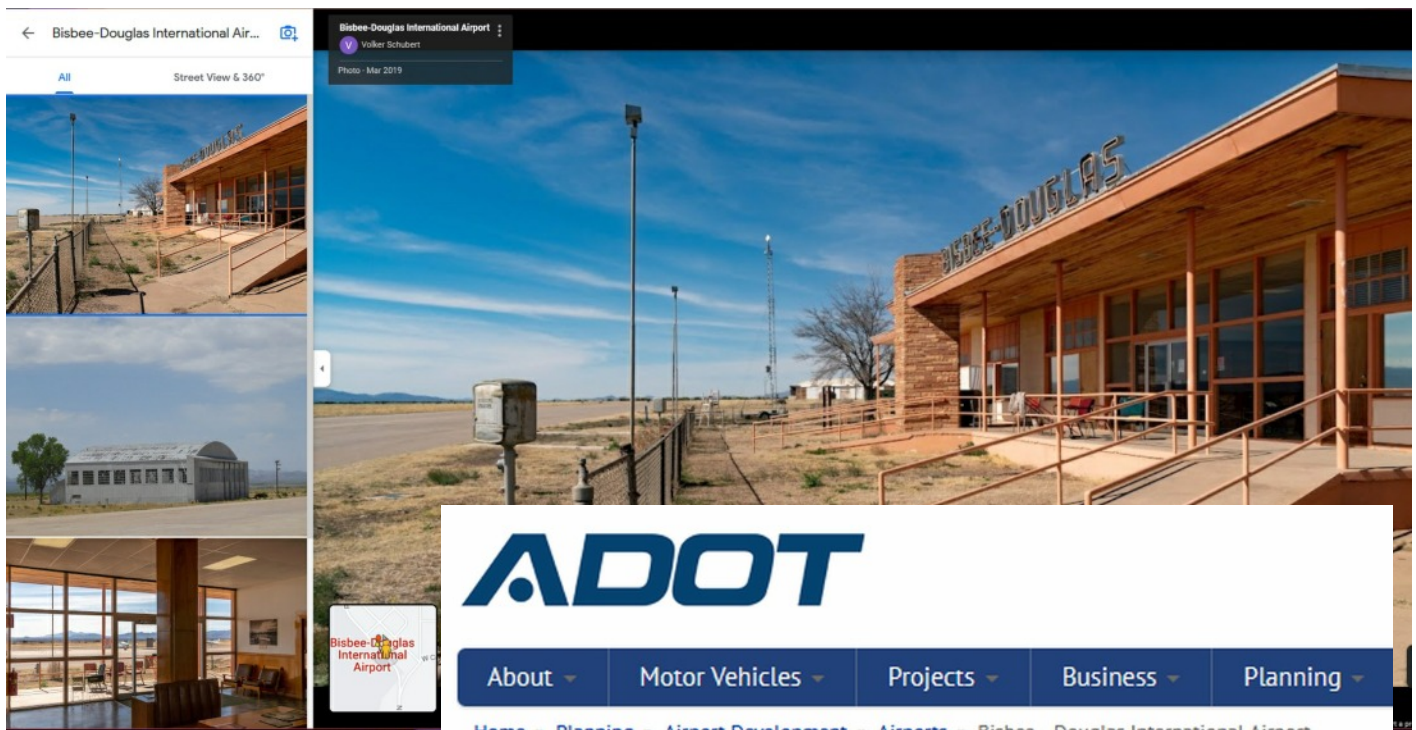
Douglas is a city in Cochise County, Arizona, United States that lies in the north-west to south-east running San Bernardino Valley within which runs the Rio San Bernardino. Douglas has a border crossing with Mexico at Agua Prieta and a history of mining. The population was 17,378 at the 2010 census.

AIRPORT OF THE MONTH - BISBEE-DOUGLAS INTL CONTINUED

Bisbee-Douglas International Airport

Overview

Bisbee Douglas International Airport (KDUG) is a public-use airport owned and operated by Cochise County. The airport was constructed between 1941 and 1943 and was used as a bomber training airfield during World War II. In 1949 the U.S. government gave the airport to Cochise County for use as a regional air transportation center. It is located 10 miles northwest of the central business district of Douglas, Arizona, and 24 miles east of Bisbee, Arizona. The airport is included in the Federal Aviation Administration's National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems, which categorizes it as a general aviation facility. Some notable tenants at the facility include the U.S. Fire Service, Arizona State Forestry Division, and the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service.

Bisbee Douglas International Airport (IATA: DUG, ICAO: KDUG, FAA LID: DUG) is a county-owned airport 9 miles (7.8 nmi; 14 km) northwest of Douglas[1] and 17 miles (15 nmi; 27 km) east of Bisbee, both in Cochise County, Arizona, United States, that was formerly known as Douglas Army Airfield (Douglas AAF).[1] The FAA's National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems for 2009–2013 categorizes it as a general aviation facility.[2]

World War II

Bisbee Douglas International Airport was originally constructed during World War II as a U.S. Army Air Forces installation known as Douglas Army Airfield. Douglas AAF conducted advanced training in the AT-9 Jeep, AT-17 Bobcat, and C-45 Expeditor training aircraft and the B-25 Mitchell bomber.[3]

In addition to Douglas AAF, five auxiliary airfields were constructed in the area for emergency and overflow use:

McNeal Field (Aux #1) 31°36'21"N 109°39'09"W

Forrest Field (Aux #2) 31°22'27"N 109°40'30"W

Webb Coutland (Elfrida) Field (Aux #3) 31°46'24"N 109°41'49"W

Auxiliary Field 4 is unknown

Hereford Army Airfield (Aux #5) 31°24'57"N 110°08'51"W

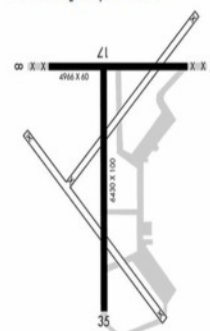
