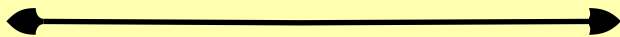

NOMINATION OF OFFICERS FOR NOVEMBER ELECTION

Flight Advisor

- o An EAA Flight Advisor is a chapter-nominated and EAA Headquarters-appointed position based on an individual's experience as a pilot, especially with flight-testing.
- o Helps a pilot of a newly constructed aircraft conduct a self-evaluation of his or her piloting skills, as well as the flying characteristics of the aircraft to determine whether he or she is capable of test flying that airplane.
- o Suggests best practices to follow during flight-testing (e.g. runway selection, weather minimums, etc.).

Technical Counselor

- o An EAA Technical Counselor is a chapter-nominated and EAA Headquarters-appointed position predicated on an individual's experience with aircraft construction.
- o Help members present a "zero defect" aircraft at final inspection by the FAA.

Copied from the Chapter Launch Kit, Revision 12/2018

The election of officers and directors is as follows:

1. The Chapter President shall appoint a Nominating Committee made up of at least three (3) Chapter Members. The appointment of the Nominating Committee shall take place no later than September.
2. The appointments to the Nominating Committee shall be announced to the Chapter Members at the regular meeting in September, or earlier if a Nominating Committee has been formed at an earlier date.
3. The Nominating Committee shall canvas the current Chapter Officers and Directors to determine if they wish to seek re-election to their current position or be nominated for any other position. The Nominating Committee shall also canvas the Chapter Members of all committees and groups to seek those who may be interested in an elected position.

The election of officers and directors continued

:

Further, the Nominating Committee shall make themselves available to the Chapter Membership seeking any Chapter Members who may be interested and who are eligible to run for an elected position.

4. At the October Chapter Membership Meeting the Nominating Committee shall present to the Chapter Membership the nominations they have obtained. In addition, open nominations will be accepted from the Chapter Members during the October Chapter Membership Meeting.

5. Once all nominations have been received, a slate of nominees may be posted at the regular meeting place, or any place deemed appropriate by the Nominating Committee, and published in the chapter Newsletter and on the chapter website. Elections of Chapter Officers and Chapter Board of Directors will take place at the November chapter Membership Meeting. If deemed appropriate by the members, voting may be by written ballot and the chapter secretary shall be

Election continued responsible for the development and implementation of a process that will offer absent eligible voting members the opportunity to vote by proxy. such process shall be reviewed and approved by the Chapter Board of Directors prior to its use. The Chapter Board of Directors shall conduct and monitor the election. All votes will be counted and confirmed by the monitors and the results of the election announced to the members present. All newly elected Chapter Officers and Chapter Board of Directors shall assume their responsibilities January 1.

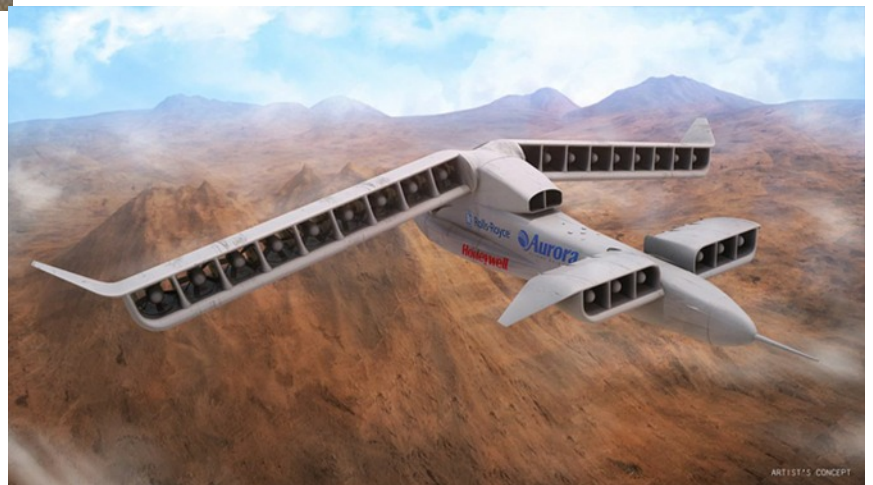

EAA CHAPTER 538 MONTHLY MEETING MINUTES FOR SEPTEMBER 14, 2021

1. Meeting was called to order at 6:30 P.M. with two (3) visitors, 21 members in person.

16. FAA FASST Team is holding a meeting on October 25 at 11 AM to get feedback on problems here at Glendale. Register online.
17. The meeting adjourned at 8:20 P.M. Mike H. first and Darren H seconded.

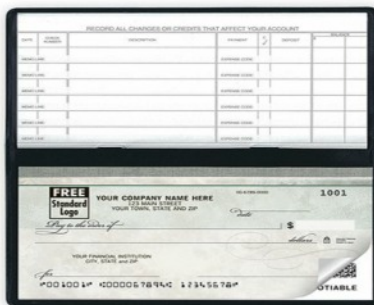

***FROM DARREN HENLEY ABOUT THE STITTS PLAYMATE ETC.***

I just spoke with you about the Stits Playmate, that we have in our hangar in Gila Bend. We received the airplane from Leroy's son, after Leroy's passing. I know my dad had talked with you last year about donating the airplane to your chapter. There was one problem, he had forgotten that he sold the airplane to Larry Keitel a couple years prior for \$1. After receiving your letter. I sent Larry an email, but I did not hear back from him until today. He is fine with donating to your EAA chapter. I am leaving for Mexico on Monday, but will be back on the 16th, my dad has skin cancer surgery on the 18th, a couple days after I will be starting to clean up and liquidate things in the hangar. We have several things there that possibly members of your chapter or their friends could be interested in. Scamp all metal VW powered bi-plane Corbin Baby Ace Corvair powered Both have been flown, but not in the last 8-10 years on the scamp, longer on the Baby Ace. There is a Whitman Tail Wind project. It's up on the gear, wings & tail feathers complete. Several instruments go along. There is a 1/2 VW on a running stand, has not been started in a few years. We have two or three complete Corvair engines, several Corvair blocks, one or two VW blocks, miscellaneous other parts, a lathe, welders, bead blaster, two stage compressor, and other tools & equipment. 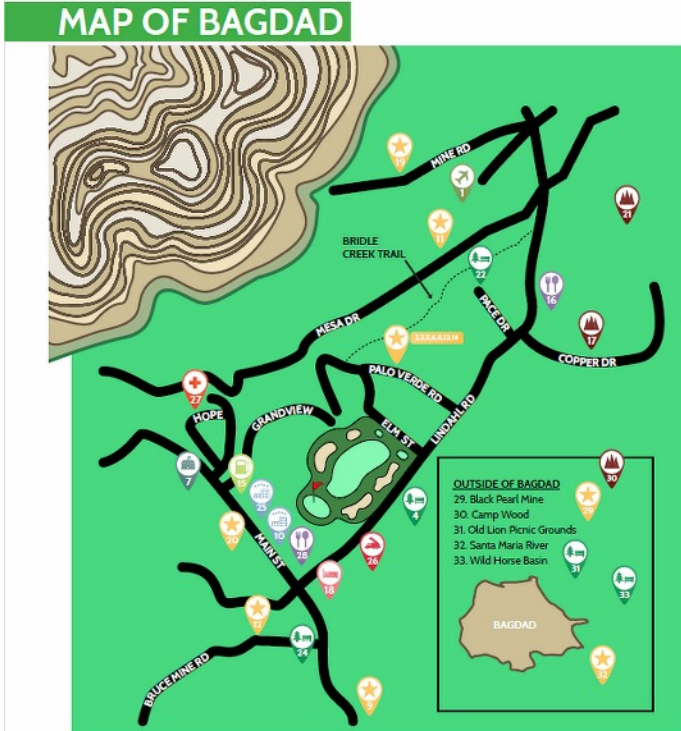
