I found the following excerpt in the AIRTRAN NEWS, the monthly newsletter of the NATA:

"In early April as the Senate was debating HR 1869 - a bill repealing the recordkeeping requirements of the fringe benefit tax law passed last year, Senator Howard Metzenbaum (D-OH) offered an amendment that could have further hurt aviation.

Metzenbaum's amendment sought to prohibit the IRS from changing its Temporary Regulations establishing the value of the personal use of business aircraft by key employees. In effect, this amendment would have negated all the efforts by the aviation community to reduce IRS' onerous proposal.

The amendment was defeated by one vote. Senator Boschwitz - MN voted NAY (in support) of the issue. NATA suggests that each member (I think you could too) contact your senator and thank him for his NAY vote."

Many of our summer events are approaching, so let's get out and support these activities. There are breakfast flights and all sorts of events. Our MSAA PIC ROAST at Bensons is June 22. Remember, we will be awarding the Holman and Lindberg Awards at that time.

Thirty-seven of us went on our annual museum work week-end at Oshkosh by means of a bus. The bus had a flat tire en route and we didn't arrive until 4:30 a.m. on Saturday, April 27th. We worked on aircraft, museum projects, at the Weeks Center, on auto, carpentry and grounds projects. This year was even better than last. On Saturday evening, we spent two hours in the museum with Chuck Larsen as our host. I am sure we will be doing this again next year. Thanks, Eleanor and Chapter 54.

At the May 3rd meeting of the MN Aviation Advisory Council, many interesting things were discussed:

- 1.) Dick Keinz reported on his representation of MN at the National Association of State Aeronautic Officials (NASAO).
- 2.) The FAA is interested in obtaining Loran C coverage, nationwide. They also anticipate utilizing more precision approaches. However, present equipment will not meet the standards for the proposed approaches.
- 3.) The number of reported near mid-air has doubled.
- 4.) A proposal is being entertained to place the interest from the \$5 billion Aviation Trust Fund into the General Fund.
- 5.) On a state level, the transfer of aircraft sales tax appears to have not passed.
- 6.) The legislature did not approve the \$80,000 for the Minnesota Aviation History book.
- 7.) The state-wide weather radar (Channel 17) may suffer again from lack of funds.
- 8.) New MNWAS terminals are going to be installed. These will be much easier to use.
- 9.) FSS is requesting more pilot reports.
- 10.) A new regulation in Part 61 and 91 regarding use of alcohol and flying is expected to be made public on July 16. This concerns the submission of pilots to alcohol tests.
- 11.) St. Cloud airport will be open only on a request basis from June-August '85.
- 12.) Farmington ARTCC will have an open house on June 8 - 9, 10 a.m. - 5 p.m.
- 13.) Look for a complete re-write of Part 91 of the FAR.
