On several occasions during the past year there have been comments regarding the up coming

40th Anniversary of Chapter 54

The charter hanging on our meeting room wall is dated 1 March 1959. Other records seem to indicate that the chapter was recognized by Headquarters as a official chapter as of May 13, 1958. Since the first meeting apparently was held in the fall of 1957 there are numerous reasons to be celebrating during the next year or two.

According to the best recollection of Norm Weston, who along with Jesse Black signed the original charter and are still active in the chapter, the first meetings of the unorganized group took place in the fall of 1957. If anyone has information from those days the chapter historian, Rosemary Frank, would love to have them or at least the opportunity to copy them.

Chester P. Klier signed the 1959 charter as President. Paul Poberezny signed as President of EAA. At that time the national headquarters was in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

There are 31 signatures on the charter they were, Chester P. Klier, Rodger L. Gardner, Donald F. Lloyd, Frank E. Vanek, Anthony H. Just, Gordon G. Young, Jesse W. Black, Robert J. Hill, LeRoy J. Lind, Robert J. Okoneski, Andrew J. Green, Oscar Ringgald, Thomas C. Gantzer, L. J. Lindell, Ward E. Holliday, Phillip J. Schwenk, Robert Reeve, Harold F. Elig, Donald J. Keating, Norman A. Weston, Ronald C. Witt, Fred R. Kloskin, MAX CONRAD, Bernard O. Malm, Frank V. Silois, E. Burt Bigelow, Russell Schmidt, and four that write as bad as I do.

Who were the other officers at the time the charter was issued. To the best of my knowledge no record exists with this information. Rosemary Frank, Secretary and Historian, has been asked to contact Oshkosh in an attempt to reconstruct the record of office holders during the past almost 40 years.


