MAC Commissioner Reedy attended the first meeting. Commissioner Kahler attended the second one.


RATES AND CHARGES

Hints and Tips by Gatis

The following maintance notes have time deadlines and should be looked into by aircraft owners.

AD 93-18-03

This year Precision Airmotive (formerly Marvel-Schebler) one piece venturi AD goes into effect. If your carburetor does not have a "V" stamped on the front data plate you will be required to have a new venturi installed by the end of October of this year. This applies to MA-3 and some MA-4 carburetors. MA-4-5 carbs should have had this done in the 60's.

AD96-09-06

Brackett Air Filters has a repetitive 100 hour inspection on the neoprene gasket between their air filter assembly and the aircraft air box. The fix is to replace the filter assembly with a redesigned one which does not allow the deteriorated gasket to be sucked into the carburetor. It's not expensive and will have to be replaced within 500 operating hours of June 7, 1996.


