SOUTH EASTERN SPORT AVIATION COUNCIL included us in the mailing of their newsletter which contained the new FAA restrictions on experimental aircraft. These restrictions replace those of February 1973 which came about as a result of the F-86 accident in California. Due to the length of this regulation I am attempting to summarize them. They tend to separate the High Powered aircraft from homebuilts, the line being drawn at 800HP. They appear to run along the lines that we have been operating under, establishing who will operate, where, under what circumstances, and who is the authority. If you are now flying a homebuilt or soon to be flying one, obtain a copy of the regulation from the FAA.
