- Individuals or companies who rent airplanes now must provide insurance information to pilots who fly them, the Michigan Department of Transportation said recently. The requirement is a result of a bill recently signed into law by Michigan Governor James J. Blanchard.
"Without this information, a renting pilot can be exposed to excessive costs and liability claims from passengers or others involved if the pilot has an accident," said William E. Gehman, MDOT Deputy Director for Aeronautics. Sounds like a good idea for other states.
