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MINNEAPOLIS CLASS B AIRSPACE

The FAA has been working on revising the Minneapolis Class B airspace since early in 2000. Key timelines and events that have occurred are:

- 1. On October 30, 2000, the FAA announced two informal public meetings on the proposed expansion those meetings were held on January 9 and January 13, 2001.
- 2. On March 7, 2001, EAA submitted it's comments on the proposal, and among other items requested a VFR transition corridor be established along a north/south line from Airlake airport (LVN) to the Gopher VORTAC (GEP).
- 3. The public meetings and EAA comments were the catalyst for the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee that was formed by the Minnesota DOT, Office of Aeronautics. The committee was comprised of representatives from EAA, Minnesota Soaring Clubs, International Aerobatics Club (IAC), and other aviation organizations and concerned individuals. The committee held two meetings May 14, 2002 and June 25, 2002. Two of the committees recommendations raise the floor of the proposed Area E from 6,000 feet to 7,000 feet, and not to cancel existing waivers for aerobatic boxes, were accepted by the FAA.
- 4. On November 24, 2003, the FAA published another request for public comments to a revised proposal. This proposal included many of the changes that came directly from public comments and the work of the Ad Hoc Committee.
