Paul described about all the weather you need to know before even attempting to navigate rising terrain. Paul showed several slides of beautiful mountains and country side he shot as he navigated from California to Oshkosh one year in a Cessna. He spent a lot of time on the west coast flying this very mountainous countryside so he knew what he was talking about. As a matter of fact he mentioned that he tried to shove in a two class on mountain flying, which he teaches, into our half hour of time allotted during our meeting. I thought he did a very good job and I really enjoyed it. Mountain Flying via Lite-Plane

Speaking of Paul Rankin's talk on mountain flying I must mention that we have a bunch of Pulsar pilots who always fly over the peaks. And we are talking on sometimes only 80HP! Most Pulsars are equipped with the popular Rotax engine with horsepower range from 80HP to 100HP. We have a very nice gathering of Pulsars in Lawrence, KS every year around September and Pulsars from the California coast to Washington D.C. come, we often hear stories of how they fly the mountain passes to get there. One pilot comes from the Seattle area every year and one came from Idaho one year. So it is possible to navigate the mountains, even with a low powered aircraft.
