Airventure is great because one can see new products, talk to other product representatives and purchase needed supplies, usually at a discount. I saw a new composite ground adjustable prop at the Sensenich booth. Sensenich has been building wooden props for years —I had a Sensenich prop on the Titan and I liked it. The new prop is a composite prop—they have been making wood props. Vans had a the same composite prop on their prototype, RV13—then I saw the same prop on the Cessna light sport proof of concept. Sensenich has been testing the prop in airboats for 4-5 years and they were ready to sell the prop for aviation uses.

to adjust a prop blade angle with very precise accuracy.

To make the new prop fit, I needed a prop extension—Sensenich did not make the size I needed so I contracted Mark German from Aero Fab to fabricate the extension. Mark built a Kolb Kolbra and has a machine shop where he makes aviation related products. As I was installing the prop and extension I realized I would need to modify the cowl also. Tom Gibbons offered to help—he really knows fiberglass techniques. The cowl is as strong as new and looks good.



I installed the prop according to the instructions with some help from Chapter 54 members on a Saturday morning. The prop is nice looking and looked great on the plane but there were immediate problems with vibration—on initial install one could see the engine shaking at idle. I checked everything again and reinstalled it a couple of times—each time checking with the digital level to make the prop blades within .1 degrees difference between the blades. After all that –still way too much vibration. I could put the old prop on and there was very low vibration so I assigned the vibrations to the prop.

I return the prop to Sensenich and they send me new blades and checked the hub. After more installations and rechecking still too much vibration so I send it back again and they send me a totally new package—all parts are new. The weigh each blade and check the center of gravity of each blade to match them. This time there was less vibration so I took it for a test flight.

The plane took off very well—I had better climb out speed and faster climb rate. Down wind was faster at a given rpm too, but the vibrations were so bad, things were vibrating off the dashboard. There was a buzz that was not normal. I sent it back and reinstalled the trusty Ivo prop.



The vibrations could have been due to softer engine motor mounts so I switched to new bushings, resynchronized the carbs and checked everything else I could think off. Others are still buying and using the prop so I think it is a good prop just not for my plane. The planes that the prop is working well on have the dynofocal mounts and the Rotax engines use barry mounts. Sensenich is a very good company and they make excellent props—I would try another composite prop if they make some design changes that would lower vibrations.

Our Chapter 54 pilots and ground support provided Young Eagle flights to a total of 41 kids in May. A special Young Eagle event was scheduled on 5 May for a group of boy scouts who camped out at Lake Elmo over the weekend. The weather was not suitable for flying and the Young Eagle event was canceled. Our regularly scheduled event on 12 May produced 36 Young Eagles for a busy but enjoyable day. We hosted another special event on 16 May for 5 Young Eagles from a local school.

We have made some procedural changes that will make the events flow better. One of the changes involves the completed registration forms which are no longer given back to the child to hold until his flight. The completed forms will go directly to the manifester who will use them to assign a pilot to the next child in line for a flight. The manifester will give the registration form to an escort who will locate and walk the child to get the certificate printed and then out to the waiting airplane. Once the escort is assigned a child, he will be with that child until he turns the child over to the pilot. This seems to be working much smoother from a logistics standpoint. Printing the certificates gives them a professional appearance and has been very well received.

Another great addition to our Young Eagles program is a new photo album that Paul has added to the EAA54 web site. This on-line photo album will generate a lot of excitement and goodwill.
