There were three other candidates for the three open seats on the board. Our new board members at large are Tim Reberg, Jeff Hove, and Dick Wicklund. These board members serve as representatives for the membership at large whenever the board meets. Any member having issues or concerns that they would like discussed at the meetings is welcome to attend themselves or to contact one of the three at-large directors to represent them.

The benches from our viewing area have been moved into the Leiter hangar and will be put back out next spring. Prior to being put out, they will need to be coated with a wood preservative.

The chapter owns tools and equipment, but we need to assemble a list of items. There is an engine hoist available. Any members having tools that belong to the club should let one of the officers know.

Many members also have specialized tools that they would be willing to share so anyone having need of tools should check with the club before they purchase a specialized tool that they need only once.

VOTING ON BY-LAWS

EAA Chapter 54; "Speed Holman", is a member of the national Experimental Aircraft Association. The association requires that all member clubs have by-laws approved by the members and which contain certain language pertaining to membership and other matters of club governance. In addition, Chapter 54 is registered as a 501 c3 organization; that registration carries with it certain requirements as to governance of the organization.

Two years ago the executive committee undertook a review of the by-laws and determined that slight changes were needed in order to be in compliance with all requirements. All club documents were gathered and assembled into a permanent record that will be maintained by the club secretary. In addition, the proposed by-laws were reviewed by the national organization's representative and an attorney (acting pro bono) and found to be acceptable. The board met to review the entire document; they approved the document and have sent it forward with a recommendation that the membership approve. The final step in the by-laws amendment process is this vote.

Please review the by-laws that have been included with this newsletter. Votes will be collected and tallied, the final vote will be reported in the January newsletter and voted at the December meeting.
