EAA Chapter 55 Board of Directors Meeting, Wednesday, May 8, 2024

→ The meeting was called to order at 7:07pm by President Rick Laub. In attendance were Rick Laub, Gilda Tucker, Drew Seguin, John Kuchar, Jeff Shaud, Gabe Blosser, Ken Drewyor (arrived 7:15), Bob Clark, Greg Hover, Gary Nicola, and Warren Miller. Absent were Dave James and Michael Rosencrans. Also in attendance were non board members Doug Koons and Margie Clark. → Secretary's Report was noted; Drew made a motion to accept the report; seconded by Doug; motion carried. > Treasurer's Report was noted. Gilda made a motion to accept the report; seconded by Gabe; motion carried. >Doug Koons announced that our 2023 Ray Scholarship recipient Cal Hayslette has completed his final check ride! Cal has completed all the necessary requirements and is now

an officially licensed private pilot. >Recoating the member hanger roof needs to be completed as soon as possible. The only holdup now is an insurance issue. Drew is handling this issue and is expecting a speedy resolution. Gilda made a motion that the board approve the \$6,000 expenditure needed to complete the roof project, with the provision that the insurance issue is resolved; Greg seconded the motion; motion carried. > April Youth Meeting was scheduled for the same day as the LCC Drone Safety Day on the Lansing Community College Campus. The plan was to simply conduct the Youth Meeting at LCC and allow the youth to participate in the drone activities. However, insurance issues rendered that impossible. Thus, the youth could "volunteer" to show up at LCC to participate unofficially. Several did so. Rick Laub was at the event and gave a glowing report of the success of the venture. Since the next scheduled youth meeting falls on Mother's Day, (May 12th) the meeting is cancelled. →Insurance for upcoming events is handled by John Kuchar. We are covered for Dawn Patrol and Mason Aviation Day. He is still working on insurance for Civil Air Patrol. → Saturday after next (May 18th) is the Young Eagles event in Owosso. Pilots from other chapters, or from other than our chapter, will be on hand to help out. We are still in need of flight line workers. (Signup sheets are out on the tables for this event & our upcoming YE) Lunch will be provided at the Owosso event. Snacks and water will also be available. We will be setting up inside the terminal. →Close out this month will be handled by Greg Hover, who switched with Gabe. Gabe will handle the October close out. >Greg Hover is organizing Dawn Patrol and Mason Aviation Day events. Workers are needed. Indicate willingness to volunteer by utilizing the sign-up sheets. > Deanna has resigned as newsletter editor. Gilda will find a way to get the May newsletter out. A call for those interested in taking over the editor position will go out at the upcoming member meeting. → Doug repainted the picnic tables at a cost of approximately \$61. Gary mentioned that this Saturday from 11am-1pm is a flyover at the National Mall. Discussion ensued over how to align the technology to view the event on our hanger screen. EAA Chapter 55 Membership Meeting, Saturday, May 11, 2024

→ Meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by President Rick Laub. > After the National Anthem, Rick thanked the breakfast team: Pat Salow, Frank Garcia, and Joe Madziar. The June breakfast team consists of: Bill Bezdek, Don Frank, Dave Cook, Lisa Fredline, and Lee Paquette. → There were thirty members present including new member James Wise, a cardiac nurse who wants to earn his private pilot license and fly his family on trips. There were no guests. → Secretary's Report was noted. John Kuchar made a motion to accept the report; seconded by Joe Madziar; motion carried. → Treasurer's Report was noted; after a brief summary of the report by Treasurer Drew Seguin, Margie Clark made a motion to accept the report; seconded by Jon Iversen; motion carried. → Jeff Shaud was not available to give the Youth Report, however Rick Laub gave a recap of the recent meeting of the youth. Although unofficial, (due to insurance issue), the Youth met at Lansing Community College to participate in Drone Safety Day. The event was a successful venture. → Doug Koons announced that our 2023 Ray Scholarship recipient Cal Hayslette successfully passed his final check ride and is now an official licensed private pilot! He took his mom on his first ride with a passenger. > Margie Clark is heading up the Young Eagle event in Owosso next Saturday. Workers need to arrive by 9am to set up a safety barrier, as rides will begin at 10am. The safety barrier is to keep people away from the airplanes. A nearby restaurant will be providing a complimentary lunch to workers. Water will also be provided on site. Flight line workers are needed, not only for this event but for all Young Eagle events associated with our chapter. Our chapter has flown over 5,000 youths. Our recent Ray Scholarship, Cal Hayslette came first to our chapter as a Young Eagle. Drivers going to Owosso can help carry games and entertainment for those waiting for rides. Some are saying there may be as many as 1000 who will want rides. There are five pilots from our chapter and there will be other pilots as well. All who work directly with the youth need to have an updated Child Protection Form on file with Margie. Jeff Stetson asked if he could bring his glider as a static display (just for viewing). The answer was an emphatic "Yes"! * John Kuchar thanked everyone who signed the card when he was in the hospital recovering from hip surgery. He appreciated everyone's concern and care. >Doug Koons has

headed up the roof resurfacing project. The only holdup is a liability insurance issue. \$6,000 was approved at the board meeting to complete the project with the stipulation that the insurance issue be resolved prior to initiating the work. >Dawn Patrol on June 15th is being organized by Greg Hover. Those willing to volunteer are encouraged to sign up. +Rick Laub mentioned that Doug Koons painted the picnic tables recently as well as mowed the lawn, redid the Dawn Patrol Banners, and fixed the broken lock on the chapter hanger door. While not all damage can be fixed, broken parts from two or more identical indicators can often be salvaged to create a single, functional whole.

I'm especially looking for Clocks, Altimeters, Gyros, Fuel gauges, and Airspeed indicators. I'm also looking for toggle switches, warning lights, and old control boxes. I don't mind getting my hands' dirty digging through hangars looking for stuff. One pilot's junk is another's treasure! 


