

With Sharron Hacker's return to Lansing she is no longer represented by proxy. The minutes were approved as published in the newsletter with one correction. The address of Chapter 55 needs to be changed to 643 Aviation Drive. Sharron reported \$1,761 of net income for the year and \$552 of net income for the previous month. The plane is on its gear with the engine installed. There are many custom-built parts going under the cowl of this beauty, all made by Jim. He recently completed the Cadillac Gold/Pearl paint job, which will make this Glasair one of a kind.



Notes from Cape Juby By Terry L. Lutz, Chapter 55 Flight Advisor

This will be a shorter than normal *Notes* because I have been on a fast-moving roller coaster ride for the past two months, trying to finish up my homebuilt project. As many of you know, I moved it from my home to Tripp Creek Airport for paint on March 21st.

Bob Parker has done an absolutely magnificent job with the paint work, despite some challenges with fiberglass pinholes and the paint maskers for some of the markings. When you all get to see it, you'll realize just how hard he worked. We had already rigged the wings and the tail, so they went on fairly easily after paint.

And then came some of the hardest challenges of all: trying to get all the systems associated with engine to play properly. The first was the fuel system. Van's Aircraft issued a service bulletin earlier this year about safetying the fuel pick-up tube. This tube could come loose and if you had less than ½ tank of fuel, you couldn't feed the remainder. I had already sealed the fuel tank at the wing root, but because the wings were still off, I had the pleasure of doing it again. Yuk! The fuel sealant is very sticky stuff!

When we finally got ready to run the engine, I put 5 gallons in each tank, and we started out by doing some leak checks all through the system. No problems noted, but for some reason, the carburetor had a small leak in the aft corner above the air box, and the accelerator pump was not squirting fuel into the carburetor throat. The carb had purportedly been overhauled when I bought the engine from the previous owner. I should have had it checked out before we got this far. Ron Cooper took one look at it and noted that the carb halves were held together by the wrong fasteners. He knew right then we were in for trouble. "A game of hide and seek...they hide it, and we have to find it." Using parts from an older core carburetor and some new replacements gaskets, etc, Coop overhauled it in record time.

Many years ago, when the Luscombe Silvaire Bullet was restored, we got to the point of running the engine, and it just would not start. I cranked and cranked and cranked on it. With Dad in the cockpit, I called for the switches to be off, so I could clear the carb of fuel. I pulled it through once, and while there wasn't any excitement there, the sound was different. So with the switch off, I called from just the brakes, and cranked it to life with the switches OFF! Well, they were in fact ON in the ON position, but the mag likes the circuit to be open (not grounded). History repeats itself (let this be a lesson to all of us!). So when my RV-8 finally did start, it only ran on two cylinders at first. It turns out that it was running on half of the electronic ignition system, and not at all on the mag. Yes, the mag switch was in fact ON, but not ON as far as the mag was concerned. We fixed the wiring to the electronic system (a phasing problem), and reversed the mag switch, and voila!

But on that first engine run, the prop governor would not cycle (it was properly overhauled), and the alternator supplied by Van's would not charge. So the governor went back to the overhauler in Ohio, and we found a replacement alternator at Car Quest. Both of them have to be re-installed before we can run again. And still, there are many things to do, like making sure everything is properly marked in the cockpit, before the DAR can complete the inspection. It ain't over 'til it's over, as they say.

My left hand still does not know what the right hand is doing. Or at least looking out for what the right hand MIGHT be doing. After being drilled twice with a #40 drill, it has now been skewered completely through with a pick being used on the carburetor mounting plate. Ouch! The tetanus shot hurt, too.

Anyway, attached is a pix of the weight and balance exercise, which didn't turn out too bad. The overall empty weight was 1114 lbs, and the balance was very close to the example in Van's construction manual. If all goes well this week, you might get to see it in person on Saturday.



As always, don't forget to lend a hand to your fellow pilot when they need it. And some of us need it a whole lot!

A Bit of Humor from Kyle Bradford From the Clipper Pioneer Newsletter


Student Pilot: I'm lost; I'm over a big lake and heading toward the Big E.
