The 1968 Apollo 8 was the mission first to circle the moon. The famous Earth-rise photo taken on that mission was taken by Bill Anders. He perished in a plane crash in which he was flying alone. He was 90. → After the National Anthem, Rick thanked the breakfast team, Lee Paquette, Bill Bezdek, and Joe Madziar. Next month's breakfast team consists of, Karen Hover, Bruce Thorburn, Ivan Bradley and Albert Esser. →There were four guests, including a youngster who came for the Young Eagle flight. Including guests there were thirty-three present. → Secretary's Report was noted. 


