We are accepting applications from students in the LCC aircraft maintenance programs. Each applicant should have the ability to complete all academic requirements, and their academic records should verify that. An applicant's life, attitude, and scholarship should be exemplary. Submission of this application includes your permission for EAA Chapter 55 to use your name and photo in our Wingtips newsletter, promotional press releases and announcements.

Our scholarship awards committee will judge and rank applications. Their recommendations will be considered by our board of directors whose decisions are final.

Please complete this application packet completely and return it to your school Administrator. We will notify selected applicants when to appear for an interview. We expect interviewees to be ready to tell us about academic progress at their 14 CFR Part 141 or 147 program; themselves outside of their school environment; work experiences in fields of aviation; why they deserve a scholarship; and goals for the future.

Scholarship recipients will receive:

- o Monetary award paid directly to the school for tuition and fees
- o A six month free trial membership to EAA national, headquartered in Oshkosh, WI. This includes their magazine "Sport Aviation".
- o A one year honorary membership to EAA Chapter 55 here at KTEW, including our monthly newsletter "Wingtips".

We expect scholarship recipients to:

- o Attend an EAA Chapter 55 meeting to acknowledge and receive award of the scholarship, and be introduced to our members.
- o Assist EAA Chapter 55 at our events of Dawn Patrol, Mason Aviation Day and Young Eagle rallies.

Each applicant must attach a short essay (no more than one page) explaining the following:

- o What inspired or motivated you to select this aviation career?
- o What are your life goals and how would this scholarship help you achieve them?
- o Briefly describe any academic achievements
