

Ken's Aviation Museum of the Month

Located on the campus off the Kalamazoo/Battle Creek Airport, the Kalamazoo Air Zoo is one of the premier aerospace & science museums in the US. Founded in the late 1970's by former WASP pilot, Sue Parrish the museum was home to numerous flyable aircraft with a special emphasis on the Grumman "Cats" and Naval Aviation in WW2 and afterwards. In 2004 a massive expansion was undertaken that included a state of the art building for displays and other permanent exhibits.

The new "Flight Innovation Center" houses an SR-71 Blackbird, F14 Tomcat, B25 Mitchell, P-39 Aracobra, and Ford Tri-Motor among many others all within steps of each other, There is a separate wing that now houses the WW2 and Naval Aviation aircraft. There are many excellent exhibits that include Women In Aviation, Bessie Coleman, and Guadalcanal. Another wing is devoted to space exploration and has a Saturn rocket booster along with a large amount of interactive exhibits. There is also a history of the scientists that developed rocketry.

Also in the same building are a variety of activities ranging from aviation themed amusement park style rides for small children, to a series of HD full motion F-16 simulators. There is also a small theater that takes you through a full motion B-17 bombing raid.

The original museum space, now known as the East Campus, still hold a number of aircraft, engines and cockpits. Much of the building is now part of the restoration center. Currently in progress are a FM-2 Wildcat and SBD-2P Dauntless, both of which were rescued from the bottom of Lake Michigan. Last year the Air Force donated an F-117 Nighthawk to the museum, and that is currently being worked on in preparation for display.

The museum operates Monday - Saturday 9am-5pm and Sunday Noon-5pm

In addition to Lumanair, Carver Aero acquired ATS Illinois, an aircraft maintenance and servicing company that has operated at the Aurora Municipal Airport since 1992.

"It's been a wonderful ride," said Mike Luman. "Our dad started the business in 1960 at the former Aurora Airways Airport, south of



Interstate 88 and west of Lake Street. We've had several offers over the years, but we were waiting for the right people and the right company to come along that would continue the legacy of our family. Carver Aero is that company."

Carver Aero has fixed-base operations in Muscatine, Davenport, Council Bluffs, in Iowa, in Janesville, Wis., and now in Aurora. Carver Aero provides corporate and general aviation services, including charter flights, corporate pilot services, airplane maintenance, turbine, and jet engine maintenance and repairs, avionics, flight training, fuel services, and aircraft storage.



EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2021: Facts and Figures

Attendance: Approximately 608,000 – Only the third time attendance has surpassed 600,000 and within 5 percent of 2019's record total.

Total aircraft: More than 10,000 aircraft arrived at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh and other airports in east-central Wisconsin. At Wittman alone, there were 16,378 aircraft operations in the 10-day period from July 22-31, which is an average of approximately 116 takeoffs/landings per hour when the airport is open.

Total showplanes: 3,176 included: A record 1,420 vintage aircraft registered, plus 1,089 homebuilt aircraft, 354 warbirds, 148 aerobatic aircraft, 112 seaplanes, 33 ultralights, and 27 rotorcraft.

Camping: More than 12,000 sites in aircraft and drive-in camping accounted for an estimated 40,000 visitors.

Volunteers: More than 5.000 contributing in excess of 250.000 hours.

Commercial exhibitors: 747.

Forums, Workshops, and Presentations: A total of 1,055 sessions hosted throughout the week.

International guests: Despite travel restrictions that greatly limited the number of attendees from other nations, EAA still welcomed visitors from 66 countries during the week.

The Gathering shines: The EAA Aviation Foundation's annual event to support its aviation education programs attracted more than 500 people and raised more than \$1.7 million dollars that will be focused on EAA's mission of growing participation in aviation.

Media: 567 media representatives on-site, from four continents.

June Answers:

In June I asked you to explain

What is this interesting bit of aviation's past and what might it's relationship be to something you might be doing on any evening to relax and unwind from a hard day's labor?



What you are looking at is Planet Aircraft Limited's first and only foray into aircraft manufacture, The 'SATELLITE', commonly referred as the 'Planet Satellite'. The plane was designed by John Nelson Dundas Heenan. Heenan worked for the British Air Ministry during World War II and was one of those who foresaw a post war boom in civil aviation. Heenan decided the 4 to 5 person plane should be built using a magnesium alloy with zirconium. Due to a lack of experience working with this type of metal Heenan's company HW&S approached Magnesium Electron LTD to build the aircraft. Magnesium Electron was owned by Distillers Company LTD and they formed a partnership with Heenan's company to create Planet Aircraft LTD to construct and produce a new aircraft they named 'Satellite'. Distillers Company LTD was founded in 1877 and produced Scotch whiskey and was acquired by Guinness in 1986 forming United Distillers in 1987.

After a gear collapse during taxi tests was fixed, cracks were discovered in the planes magnesium keel after a 20 foot high test flight. Distillers Company had already sunk over 100,000 pounds in the project and withdrew further funding when it was discovered that another 40,000 pounds plus was needed to resolve the Satellite's deficiencies. The plane was moved to Redhill Aerodrome, near London, where it slowly deteriorated until 1958, when it was finally scrapped. Most likely by coincidence, the basic layout of the Planet Satellite was resurrected in the late 1970's as the Lear Fan 2100, Bill Lear's Last design before his death in 1978.

Hope you enjoyed this months trip down aviation's history byway, now you can sit back and relax with a bit of good single malt or a cold glass of Guinness!


