Canada's SkyHawks & the USAF A-10 Demo Team Confirmed for Oshkosh

Two big additions to the EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024 lineup were confirmed in the past week, as the Canadian Armed Forces SkyHawks skydiving team and the U.S. Air Force A-10 Demo Team committed to performances during The World's Greatest Aviation Celebration.

The SkyHawks will attend as part of the 100th anniversary commemoration for the Royal Canadian Air Force. The SkyHawks are Canada's only



military parachute demonstration team, comprised of 13 jumpers from the Canadian Army, the Royal Canadian Navy, and the Royal Canadian Air Force. This includes both



Regular Force and Reserve members with diverse professional backgrounds. They will perform during the afternoon air shows at Oshkosh.

Meanwhile, the U.S. Air Force's A-10 Demo Team — marking its final season of air show performances — will be at Oshkosh on July 22-25. The Republic A-10 Thunderbolt II, affectionately known as the Warthog, has long been a favorite on the air

show circuit. The demo team is based at Davis-Monthan AFB and commanded by Maj. Lindsay "MAD" Johnson, who flies the aircraft at air shows throughout the country.



B-17 Aluminum Overcast now on public display at EAA Aviation Museum's Eagle Hangar

The EAA Aviation Museum's Eagle Hangar received a significant addition on Thursday May 23, as the B-17 *Aluminum Overcast* was brought in to be displayed for the first time in 30 years, as plans for its future preservation and restoration are finalized.

"The B-17 Aluminum Overcast has one of the most enthusiastic fan bases of any aircraft in EAA's collection," said Chris Henry, EAA Aviation Museum Manager. "Bringing the airplane to the Eagle Hangar offers an opportunity for everyone to enjoy the airplane while we explore all the options available for the airplane's future."



Measuring more than 74 feet in length and weighing more than 36,000 pounds, the B-17 is a true heavyweight amongst World War II aircraft. The B-17 was primarily used as a bomber in World War II but also served other uses including transport, antisubmarine, and search-and-rescue. More than 12,000 were made, with only a handful remaining on display or airworthy.

EAA's B-17 Aluminum Overcast was delivered to the U.S. Army Air Corps on May 18, 1945. The airplane was sold as surplus the following year and served many uses including as a cargo hauler, aerial mapping platform, and in pest control and forest dusting applications. In 1978, Aluminum Overcast was sold to a group of investors known as "B-17s Around the World" who sought to return the airplane to its military roots. The economic challenges of owning a vintage bomber led the group to donate the airplane to EAA in 1983. The airplane was on display in the EAA Aviation Museum until 1993 when it was moved to start preparation for its first national tour in 1994. Aluminum Overcast carries the colors of the 398th Bomb Group of World War II, which flew hundreds of missions over Nazi-held territory during the war. Veterans of the 398th helped finance the B-17's restoration.

Blast from the Past

The EAA ad below appeared in Western Flyer magazine 50 years ago this month and features Burt Rutan's VariViggen named after the Swedish fighter plane, the Saab 37 Viggen. This and the XB-70 Valkyrie inspired the design. Rutan became interested in aircraft which resisted stalls and spins, and the VariViggen was his first full scale design. He began working with the design as a student at Cal Poly in the early 1960s, and started building the prototype in his garage in 1968. After four years of work, the aircraft made its first flight in April, 1972. The legendary designer Burt Rutan will be making six presentations at AirVenture this summer.
