An hour on the ground allowed the weather to clear up for us and about twenty other planes to head for Fisk. My landing at Oshkosh was #2 behind Aluminum Overcast! I tried to extend downwind to avoid all the churning air but the controller instructed me to tighten up my pattern! Well, the landing was not beautiful but we didn't scrape any metal!


