EAA events, activities added to ForeFlight

Thousands of EAA events and aviation activities can now be accessed on ForeFlight, thanks to a new agreement between ForeFlight and the Experimental Aircraft Association.

"Adding EAA's more than 14,000 annual aviation events makes the ForeFlight database even more comprehensive for the thousands of pilots who rely on it for flight information," said Ren Scott, EAA's director of business development. "ForeFlight has always been an excellent source of flight planning and safety, but with EAA's information it will add more reasons to fly and destinations to discover."

The cooperative effort is now officially live, giving EAA chapters an opportunity to update their upcoming activities on EAA's calendar of events. That calendar will regularly and automatically be loaded into the ForeFlight database for pilot reference.



Honoring a Fallen Veteran



The picture on the right is U.S. Army Air Force 2nd. Lt. Robert L. E. Porter, of Chicago. Second Lt. Porter was just 23 years old and a navigator onboard a B-24J Liberator when heavy anti-aircraft fire brought it down over Gotha, Germany on Feb. 4, 1944. His remains were initially not found, and after a year listed as missing in action, Porter was declared dead.

In 2023, the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA), a US Department of Defense agency that works to recover and identify American military personnel located the plane wreckage. Then in December 2023, Porter's remains were identified. The family was notified in January 2024.

Porter's remains returned to Chicago Friday, June 7, when he received an escort from Midway Airport, to an Orland Park funeral home and then again on Monday, June 10, to his resting place in the Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery in Elwood.







On June 10th, Mike Baer was contacted by Dave Skinner, a member of the Illinois Chapter of Rolling Thunder, who was looking for a volunteer pilot or pilots who would be willing and able to do a fly over in honor of 2nd. Lt. Porter during the funeral service. Mike reached out to all of the pilots he knew to try to find someone willing and able to help.

Honoring a Fallen Veteran

When I first read Mike's email, I wasn't enthusiastic about participating, but the more I thought about it, I realized I had to do it. Cindy and I were on a tour last year where we visited Belgium, Luxembourg, the American Cemetery there, the Ardennes Forest (Battle of the Bulge) and the beaches of Normandy in France. My knowledge of WWII was pretty thin before that, so now my understanding of the war and the individual sacrifices made by so many of that generation made me know I owed it to this fallen airman and his family to pay this tribute.

I called David Skinner for more information and he put me in touch with Tom Buck who would be the lead in his AT-6. We met up at KLOT. Steve in his yellow RV-7A, Butch in his Cessna 150 with a military themed paint scheme and I in my RV-7 made up the team. The Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery in Elwood was not far from KJOT, so in a loose echelon formation, we made 3 passes over the interment ceremony.

David Skinner reported later that the family was surprised and very grateful for the flyover. I'm glad that I did it and would certainly do it again if the opportunity arises.

Arlington Heights Police Drone Program

Five years ago, Arlington Heights Police pioneered the use of drones, in May they deployed the first specially fitted SUV from which an officer can launch a drone in less than a minute.

From the outside the Drone Response Vehicle looks like any other Arlington Heights police SUV, pop open the rear hatch and you'll find sliding black drawers that contain one of the department's three drones, an attachable 110-decibel speaker and blue-and-red flashing lights. Then there's a 32-inch television monitor that slides out and provides pilots a large, high-definition view of what the drone is seeing. It can also send live footage back to the police station, a command vehicle, and even officers' cellphones. The department now has 26 officers licensed to fly the drones.

Drones have been used to locate missing children and seniors, watch for problems at village events, track down fleeing suspects, and gather evidence at crime and crash scenes. Before drones, when we had a fatal crash, we'd have the road closed down for four to eight hours to investigate, now we can set the drone to cover a grid pattern over the scene and have the road reopened in 30 to 60 minutes.

Among its other key features is a thermal detection camera that allows police to locate people through their body temperature, even when otherwise hidden or obscured by darkness. Or in a case when you have an armed suspect out there, maybe in a wooded or covered area, you can find them

through their heat

Lancaster bomber added to Royal Canadian Air Force centennial at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024

One of the rarest warbirds in North America and one of the most modern fighter jets in the Canadian Forces have been confirmed to participate during the Royal Canadian Air Force centennial at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024. The 71st edition of the Experimental Aircraft Association's fly-in convention is July 22-28 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh.

The Avro Lancaster Mk. X bomber, the only flying example of the airplane in North America, will make its first appearance at Oshkosh since 2015. Owned and operated by the Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum in Mount



Hope, Ontario, this particular airplane was built in 1945 and served with the RCAF as a maritime patrol aircraft until 1963. After more than a decade of outdoor display, the Lancaster was fully restored and returned to flight in 1988. It is painted in the colors honoring Victoria Cross recipient Andrew Mynarski, who flew with the RCAF No. 419 "Moose" Squadron.

The Lancaster will be at Oshkosh throughout the week and on display on Boeing Plaza. It will also participate in flying demonstrations during the week.

The Canadian Forces CF-18 demo team is making its first appearance at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh. The team is a national team with members selected from RCAF units across the country. All are selected for their superior performance, dedication to excellence, and the desire to represent Canada's operational air force. Throughout the 2024 RCAF centennial season a specially painted CF-18 Hornet, featuring a unique commemorative paint job, will wow audiences at locations across Canada, the United States, and the United Kingdom as part of Operation INSPIRATION 2024. The CF-18 will perform in the afternoon air shows at Oshkosh on July 26-28, with the jet displayed on Boeing Plaza at other times.

These additions add to the already impressive lineup previously announced at Oshkosh to celebrate the RCAF centennial. The Canadian Forces Snowbirds will perform during the afternoon air shows on July 26-28, while historic warbirds from Vintage Wings of Canada will also be present throughout the week.

Blast from the Past

Do you remember all of the noise around the ADS-B mandate? It was only about 5 years ago that the FAA mandated that aircraft operating in most controlled domestic airspace be equipped with Automatic Dependent Surveillance-Broadcast (ADS-B) Out avionics by January 1, 2020. I came across the article below from 50 years ago that seemed very reminiscent of the ADS-B conversations as they rolled out the latest safety technology of the time:

ELT: Deadline is June 30

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The deadline for having an approved ELT (emergency locator transmitter) aboard your airplane is rapidly closing in. The current requirement is for the device to be installed in virtually all aircraft no later than June 30, 1974.

About the only exceptions to the rule are training flights within 25 miles of home base, ag operators, some ferry operations and air carriers.

There is also a grandfather clause permitting use of beacons installed before Oct. 1, 1971. This makes those units valid until December, 1975.

The full rules for locator beacons is in Part 91.52.


Officials have indicated there is not much of a pressure being generated in putting the devices in airplanes. Many people obviously have already installed the beacon of their choice and others are getting the units installed throughout the year.

FBOs report sales are steady, but nothing spectacular.

FAA officials again say they have no plans for any delay in the implementation of the beacon program. However, many individuals are apparently counting on such a last minute delay to avoid installing the unit.

Last year's delay in the beacon law, for a period of six months, was approved by Congress on the grounds that there were not sufficient beacons in existence to supply the demand. FAA officials point out that the beacon law was adopted by Congress, not the FAA, and delays in implementation would have to be mandated by Congress if any was to come and at mid-June there had been no indication, according to FAA spokesmen, that there would be any further delay.
