10 Best-Selling Piston Airplanes in 2023

2023 was a banner year for general aviation, with piston airplane deliveries increasing 11.8% to 1.682.

That's the takeaway from the General Aviation Manufacturers Association (GAMA) 2023 General Aviation Aircraft Shipments and Billings Report. Released Feb. 21, 2024, during the association's annual State of the Industry event, the numbers show that "every segment of general aviation improved in 2023," according to GAMA President Pete Bunce. "This is strong, steady, and sustained growth," he said. "For the first time in more than a decade, the general aviation manufacturing industry has eclipsed 4,000 aircraft delivered," he said.

Even better, billings topped \$27.8 billion, a 3.6% jump from the prior year. And even better than that, there are "robust and growing order backlogs for all segments of aircraft," Bunce reported. "This is a testament to the resilience of our industry and the integral role that general and business aviation play in our communities," he said.

The Aerospace Maintenance Council is a non-profit organization that promotes and supports the aerospace maintenance community. The organization's main event is the Aerospace Maintenance Competition (AMC), which is held annually. The AMC recognizes and celebrates aviation maintenance technicians (AMTs) and the skills needed to maintain safe, airworthy aircraft. The competition tests the knowledge, skill, and integrity of AMTs and provides an opportunity for current and future maintenance professionals to showcase their abilities. Five-member teams compete in 27 events across six categories, representing educational institutions, commercial airlines, repair and manufacturing companies, general aviation, and space.

The Lewis University team was sponsored and trained by United Airlines. The Lewis University team was awarded 1st place in fan blade removal, human factors, and the antenna fault test. B-29 Reunion Added to Warbird Highlights at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024



The world's only two flying examples of the Boeing B-29 Superfortress will make a rare joint appearance this summer during EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024, supporting the "Turning the Tide" salute to 1944 that will also commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day. The 71st edition of EAA's fly-in convention is July 22-28 at Wittman Regional Airport in Oshkosh.

It is believed to be only the fourth time two B-29s have made a joint public appearance in 50 years, with the first taking place in Oshkosh in 2017. It is the first time these aircraft have appeared together since 2018.

"As AirVenture is the world's largest annual gathering of warbirds, bringing these two iconic aircraft together is another of those 'Only at Oshkosh' moments," said Rick Larsen, EAA's vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "These airplanes are big favorites wherever they appear, but together they will make the 'Turning the Tide' commemoration even more unforgettable."

As currently scheduled, each airplane will spend time featured on EAA's Boeing Plaza. *FIFI* will be on display on July 22-24, while *Doc* will take center stage for display on July 25-28. The airplanes are also scheduled to make a formation flight at the beginning of the July 24 night air show. When not on display at Boeing Plaza, flight experiences on *Doc* July 22-25 will be based at Appleton International Airport, approximately 20 miles north.

FIFI is owned and operated by the Commemorative Air Force's <u>B-29/B-24 Squadron</u> of Dallas, Texas. It was acquired by the CAF in the early 1970s when a group of CAF members found it at the U.S. Navy Proving Ground at China Lake, California, where it was being used as a missile target. The airplane was rescued and restored, then flew for more than 30 years until 2006, when the chief pilot made the decision to ground it pending a complete powerplant re-fit. After an extensive four-year restoration that included installing four new custom-built hybrid engines, *FIFI* returned to the sky in 2010 and has since traveled coast to coast. Doc was built in 1944 and for many years was part of a squadron known as the Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs in upstate New York at Griffiss Air Force Base (hence, the name Doc). The airplane was retired in 1956 as the jet bomber age began and sat as a target for Navy training missions in China Lake, California, until 1998. A restoration group took possession of the airplane from the U.S. government and hauled it to Wichita, Kansas, in pieces in 2000. After 16 years and more than 450,000 volunteer hours, Doc made its first flight after restoration in July 2016, 60 years after it had been retired. Career Opportunities in Air Traffic Control



Michael Whitaker, administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), said earlier this month - "We know that we're understaffed throughout the population of controllers, so we have been doing everything within our power to increase controller hiring. We met our goal last year of 1,500 controllers, and will meet our goal this year of 1,800 controllers. And we're continuing to do everything we can to increase the numbers." If you are considering a career in aviation but have not explored Air Traffic Control, perhaps now is the time to do so.

B4UFLY



The FAA's B4UFLY service shows where recreational flyers can and cannot fly. Kicked off on February 1, 2024, recreational flyers who only fly their drone for fun have more resources to choose from.

The FAA has approved four companies to provide B4UFLY services through desktop and mobile applications. B4UFLY provides situational awareness to recreational flyers and other drone users.



Key features of B4UFLY include:

- Information about controlled airspace, special use airspace, critical infrastructure, airports, national parks and military training routes
- Information about Temporary Flight Restrictions for special events.
- A clear status indicator that informs the operator whether it is safe to fly or not.
 - For example, an indicator shows that flying in the Special Flight Rules Area around Washington, D.C. is prohibited.
- Informative, interactive maps with filtering options.
- The ability to check whether it is safe to fly in different locations by searching for a location or moving the location pin.
- Links to other FAA drone resources.

In July of 2023, the FAA issued a notice of proposed rulemaking, Modernization of Special Airworthiness Certification, ("MOSAIC"), which was intended to modernize its approach to Light Sport Aircraft ("LSA") by embracing technological advances and enlarging the scope of their permitted operations. Many pilots have been looking ahead to a day when the proposal is a rule, sport pilots gain access to a whole raft of new aircraft, legacy LSAs have a chance to expand their operating envelopes and many of the companies planning to make new models that fit into the MOSAIC template actually come to market.

It was understood early on that the FAA was planning on taking 16 months to review public and industry comments, starting from the close of comments. That was extended from October 2023 to January of this year. Then there was another shorter extension to fix a few "technical" issues with the original proposal, mainly relating to rules around noise and noise testing. There was chatter early on that the FAA might have some kind of announcement at AirVenture this year, but anything beyond "yes, we're still working on it" seems unlikely. The FAA tends not to do rulemaking in public (after the comment period, anyway), so it's likely that we won't hear much until we get the final rule.

But that's not the end of it. Once the FAA has published its final rule on MOSAIC, the American Society for Testing and Materials ("ASTM") committees may have to refine their standards based on the final rule and the FAA will need to approve it. Of course, this back-and-forth is already going on, so it's not like the ASTM committees are working in a vacuum and no one is predicting massive rewrites. But, according to sources, the approval process on the airframe side could take from 2 to 6 months after the rulemaking is made final. So even if the FAA and the ASTM committees are in close agreement, it still won't be an instant-on situation.

Where does that get us? According to EAA's Dick Knapinski, "It is correct that early to mid-2025 is expected to be the announcement of the final rule. We've been telling those who ask that, based on our conversations with the FAA, most recently at our annual winter summit in Oshkosh in early March." But if the approval process stretches out, it could be December of 2025 before the new rules are widely in effect.

Which means the biggest challenge we face with MOSAIC is mustering patience.
