Congratulations to Dominic Pieper on being awarded a Ray Aviation Scholarship!



As mentioned before, we had four individuals submit their application for the scholarship our chapter was awarded with earlier this year. While this was a huge opportunity for all of the applicants, we could only award the scholarship to one of them and this year, Dominic Pieper is the recipient. In addition to the Ray Aviation scholarship, Dominic will also receive a scholarship from True Course Simulations for their Private Pilot Course.

The others that submitted applications were: Raynen Burgan, Max Grant and Daniel Shumway. Chapter leadership has decided to award each of them a \$100.00 scholarship for the True Course Simulations "Intro to Flight" course which is upgradeable to the full course at a later date. We want to keep these young people engaged in pursuing their dreams of obtaining their private pilot certificate.

Dominic's scholarship award is for \$11,000.00 which is the average training cost to obtain a private pilot certificate.

As Dominic begins his journey towards earning his certificate, let all remember to be an encouragement and look for opportunities to mentor him. Maybe it's just engaging him at a chapter event and asking him how he's coming along or maybe taking him on a flight if you have an extra seat or perhaps helping him understand some of the more difficult concepts in the training process.

The Ray Aviation Scholarship is new to our chapter and I have no doubt we are fixing to learn quite a bit about how the process works. That's okay because we are up for the task and have a great team in place to be successful!

The plane successfully flew for a total of 3 flights with some of the kids that helped build the plane getting to take the controls. As the plane was lifting off on the fourth flight, there was a malfunction with the elevator control and the plane crashed. Unfortunately, the crash was pretty severe and will take quite a bit to repair it. In the meantime, we have secured a replacement plane that will be ready to fly real soon. Once it's ready, another flying day will be scheduled so that everyone who participated gets a chance to fly the airplane. Unfortunately crashes happen in the world of radio control airplanes and some would say rebuilding the wrecks is half the fun!



The replacement plane is an ARF (almost ready to fly). Because it's an ARF, it will be ready to fly in short order. It's maiden flight will be scheduled soon. If your child helped with the Build & Fly, this is for them, so plan to come out and enjoy a day of model aviation fun later this month!

The True Course Simulations ITD is 100% ready to go!

We had to work out a few things and make sure everything was in order before we could offer the sim for full use.

TJ Hess has been our "Test Pilot" during the early testing of the sim and has been instrumental in working with True Course to identify potential issues and help resolve them. Early on, something in the computer failed and it had to be replaced. That was followed by an intermittent problem with the headset losing connection. True Course stepped up and replaced the computer at no cost to the chapter and they were also able to diagnose the headset issue which turned out to be our own doing when the unit was mounted on a movable base. AJ, Kyle and the rest of the team at True Course were simply outstanding in their commitment to get the unit in tip top condition and keep it that way.

Ed Hamilton put the finishing touches on the policy for using the sim and starting this Saturday, you can sign up and begin training if you have been waiting to do so!
