# **AIRVENTURE 2023!**



Non-instrument rated pilots who want to improve their proficiency have an excellent resource through EAA's Visual Meteorological Conditions (VMC) Clubs. The purpose of EAA VMC Clubs is to build proficiency when flying under visual flight rule conditions.

EAA VMC Clubs are extensions to local EAA chapters and offer monthly meetings in which pilots can network and share knowledge and experience. The meetings use real-world scenarios to engage members, and allow a free exchange of information that improves awareness and skills. The intent is to create a commu-

nity of pilots willing to share information, provide recognition, foster communications, promote safety, and build proficiency. Through the EAA VMC club programs, visual flight rule pilots have improved their proficiency, and they love it.

We are excited about starting a VMC club within our chapter. This club will be lead by Chapter Safety Coordinator, Revone Bauwens. In order to get the club going, a minimum of 5 founding members is required. One of the 5 members is the coordinator, one has to be a CFI and the other three are members at large.

Club meetings will take place monthly and possibly on Thursday evenings. We can nail down the day and time once we have member input on what works best for the majority. It is our goal to get this club established and meeting in the coming months!


