Each day, we offer six live webinars back-to-back, starting at 11:30 am central time and running every hour and a half until the last session at 7pm central. #### A Look Back at 2023!

What a year of activity!

As our chapter began to see a resurgence of activity in late 2022, it became obvious we needed to get in compliance with the Arizona Corporation Commission and the IRS to ensure we were recognized as a 501(c)3 organization. It took a lot of hard work and dedication to see it through from Ed Hamilton and Bill Fort but they got it done and our official letter from the IRS was issued mid-2023.

Charlie Ballard stepped up as our fly-out coordinator. Although this was a new position in the chapter, Charlie was able to put together some pretty awesome fly-outs for the chapter. We flew as a group to Flagstaff for a tower tour (a special thanks to Brent Meyer for putting this together), Marble Canyon, the final flag at the Reno Air Races and a few local breakfast fly-outs (Coolidge & Sedona). A group of members piled into a Cherokee Six bound for Airventure too! What a great year of chapter fly-out activity.

We hosted (5) Young Eagle Rallies, (1) Flying Start Event and (2) Pancake Breakfast Fundraisers. We flew 113 young eagles, 11 eagles during our Flying Start Event and served 225 meals at the pancake breakfasts. This required a ton of volunteers to pull these events off successfully and would not have been possible without everyone that came together to make it happen, thank you all!

Understanding the importance of pilot proficiency, we started a VMC Club in late 2023. To date, we have had 16-18 participants at each meeting. The discussion among those in attendance has been eye opening and a great way to increase knowledge and proficiency in our piloting skills. We also had the FAA FAST team present a FAA Wings credit presentation on the recent emphasis of traffic patters into non-controlled airspace. We look to have the FAST team back again in 2024.

Chapter member projects: Tom Graves is near completion on his Sonix project. He and Bob McCalpin have been steadily working on the project and expect to complete it this year. The Show Low Aviation Club (SLAC) purchased a partially built RV-12iS project. The SLAC members have been working toward completion while waiting for the power plant and avionics to ship. They too expect to have their plane flying this year.

A couple of "Hands On" activities included, refurbishing the newly acquired Teenie-Two from the Show Low Airport. A team worked to get the Teenie-Two in working order so it could participate in the Show Low 4th of July parade and the Snowflake Pioneer Days parade. We also had an opportunity at one of our gatherings to put a RV-9A on the scales and work the weight and balance calculations as a group. This was an excellent learning opportunity. We plan to have similar opportunities in the coming year!


