Q&A: I'm interested in buying a Starduster Too located 800 miles away. The airplane has logged a little more than three hours of Phase 1 flight testing. Would I be able to fly the airplane home, then fly off the remainder of the 40 hours?

Answer: You could try to get a ferry permit from the FSDO that has jurisdiction over the area where it currently is located, but it may not be granted due to the low number of flight-test hours.

Also, once you get it back to your area, you will need to notify your FSDO that you need to have a Phase 1 testing area approved for your area. Another thing: If the engine and propeller combination installed on the Starduster has been certified together on a type-certificated airplane already, the required Phase 1 flight-testing period should only be 25 hours, not 40.

Oct 08, 1883 French brothers Albert and Gaston Tissandier make the 1st flight with an airship powered by electricity.

Oct 06, 1908 Wilbur Wright and a French writer make the 1st passenger flight of over one hour.

Oct 04, 1909 More than a million New Yorkers watched as Wilbur Wright makes a flight along the Hudson River.

Oct 07, 1909 Glenn Curtiss becomes the 1st American to hold an FAI airplane certificate.

Oct 11, 1910 President Teddy Roosevelt becomes the 1st US president to fly when he is taken up in St. Louis.

Oct 06, 1922 Lieutenants John Macready and O.G. Kelly set a new world flight endurance record, staying aloft in their Fokker T-2 monoplane for a total of 35 hours, 18 minutes and 30 seconds.

Oct 14, 1947 Captain Charles "Chuck" Yeager becomes the 1st person to fly faster than sound. Yeager "breaks the sound barrier" in his Bell X-1 airplane, Glamorous Glennis, named after his wife. He was able to reach 670-mph or

Mach 1.015 at Muroc Dry Lake, California.



Schwanke's beautiful home and enjoyed a chat about our EAA and Oshkosh. Not enough for a quorum. Don passed around his Dynon's LCD instrument for us to admire and oogle over. We also discussed possible meeting sites, since Old Rebel Field has been sold to a Mexican national named "Kilo Bravo", who has seven crop dusting planes and needs to store them on this side of the border. January 1, 2013. The new company plans on building more hangers at the airport for all his planes.

To the right is the **Schwanke's** Honda Fit car, which has the same engine they are putting into their plane!


