I took away a good lesson not to make any assumptions about weather even if just "staying local". If I had taken off from Glens Falls with weather well within my personal limits and popped over to an airport just 35 miles away, maybe without a weather station, I would have been in for a surprise and possibly circumstances beyond my ability.

Alton Bay Ice runway in New Hampshire came and went in February. They had a good season with 250 landings. Still in the bucket for me but one of these winters I will get there and maybe it will be with some of my 602 friends. A descent destination flight from our location.
