Fall fly-in is a colorful foliage feast for the eyes

EDINBURG — Saturday, Oct. 11 was a picturesque afternoon as clear blue skies and autumn-marked foliage complimented the flights of several brightly-colored parachute planes above the Great Sacandaga Lake.

The Adirondack Chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association hosted its “Fall Fly-In 2008” event at the Plateau Sky Ranch of the Edinburg Airport.

Four parachute planes went up in the air at approximately 5 p.m., including Larry Saupe of Galway and his rainbow-striped parachute, Dale Wilcox of Cobleskill with a red and white parachute, Julius Enekes of Corinth with his red, purple, and black chute, Norm Downing of Cobleskill with a multi-colored parachute, and Dave Newell of Corinth flew his powered paraglider with a yellow and blue chute.
