15)	obtain Certific approv Duluth, certain	The prerequisites for being selected for this Ray Foundation Scholarship are that you can a "Student Pilot Certificate" prior; and that you can obtain a "Third Class Medical ate" prior. Obtaining the 3 <sup>rd</sup> Class Medical requires getting a "flight physical" from an FAA-ed Aviation Medical Examiner (AME). Nearby AME's are in St. Croix Falls, Eau Claire, Stillwater. One thing Chapter 631 has learned the hard way is that if a person is on prescriptions (for ADD or ADHD, possibly other symptoms) obtaining a passing 3 <sup>rd</sup> Class I is impossible. All that said:
	a.	Are you and your parents willing to pursue a Student Pilot Certificate in somewhat short order (we can help you find a local CFI to help with that)? Such is needed for Chapter 631 to recommend you to EAA headquarters for the scholarship (note that HQ has final say on whether you will receive a scholarship).
	b.	Are you and your parents willing to pursue a 3 <sup>rd</sup> Class Medical via an FAA AME in somewhat short order (we can help you find a nearby AME)? We should discuss any medications you may be taking first as some are known to be automatic fails for 3 <sup>rd</sup> Class medical and then there would be no reason to pay for the flight physical (approximately \$150).

18) Note (not necessarily a requirement if selected): Taking flying lessons does involve some risk. Part of flying lessons is the rental of the flight school's aircraft to take lessons in. Flight schools insure their aircraft to protect/insure the flight school's financial interests (not the student's/family's). The family of any flight training scholarship recipient should research/consider the purchase of an aircraft rental insurance policy (to protect the financial interests of the student/family). Feel free to ask questions on this.
