- \$150 income in member dues
- CD which started at \$20,000 now at \$21,135; recently rolled into a new CD session.
- Young Eagle event donations to date this year = \$603.
- Not processed in July, but Dave Nielsen recently submitted \$3K in expenses for Aidan Olson Ray flight training
- Current overall balance \$36,180.13 \$8,666 in general operating fund; \$27K in Warren Lewis fund (donations for expenditures on youth programs).

# Young Eagles Update (Jack Langland):

- Received a new banner from HQ while at AirVenture "10,000 Young Eagles Flown". If weather cooperates our chapter will reach 11,000 this season. Only two other chapters have over 10,000. Wow!
- 631 received good comments from Dave Leiting at the AirVenture Young Eagle banquet

Received a nice warbirds sign. Received a Bell 47 helicopter ride w no doors! Made a composite airfoil. Made a wooden rib. Helped sand down a propeller. Was a great experience overall; thank you very much for the opportunity!
- Upcoming YE events are Rice Lake (33 kids signed up so far); and Cumberland on August 24th(25 kids signed up so far).
