

# Surprise Propellor Motion Featuring David Gagliardi

"What's something most pilots never think about but could be dangerous or deadly?" —Bobby K.


#### David:

"One day a while ago, I jumped into my airplane for a quick local flight and was shocked when I turned on the master—and the prop started turning. I shut off the master right away. Fortunately, nothing—and more importantly no one—was inside the prop arc.

This happened because the starter contactor (which can also be called the starter relay) had failed in the on position. Despite the fact that the airplane keys were still in my pocket, turning on the master powered the starter and the prop immediately started turning.

Because of this, I've added a 'Prop area - CLEAR' item before 'Master - ON' to my prestart check to ensure that if this happens again the possibilities of damage or injury are minimized.

Many of us have the essential 'prop clear' on a checklist right before turning the key, just like we have a check for oil pressure or ammeter not full scale immediately



after engine start. However, few pilots think twice about turning the master on when they first open the plane to check fuel levels, deploy the flaps, or do any of several other preflight tasks. Don't be one of those pilots. Any time you energize a system, ensure people and objects are out of harm's way."

# Traffic Pattern Ground Track Featuring Bob Martens

"For a standard single-engine piston airplane, how far from the runway should you be on downwind? I see all kinds of patterns at my home airport and it drives me crazy." — Steve B.

**Bob:** "Think about the goal of this process: to get the aircraft safely on the ground without interfering with other traffic. To me, that means staying as close to the runway as possible in the traffic pattern. Usually, a *half-mile* offset will accomplish this goal. How can we determine what a half-mile looks like? How long is the runway? Use it as a guide to determine distance.

To me, discipline is the key in the traffic pattern. There is an altitude to maintain—maintain it. There is a correct speed for your aircraft—maintain it. And there is a ground track that will allow an efficient flow of traffic for landing. Fly the ground track precisely so as to not confuse other aircraft. Wide or extended downwind legs only frustrate other pilots and can be dangerous. If we have engine problems in the pattern, we certainly want to land on the runway.

Standardization is another important quality to integrate into our traffic patterns. Establishing a flow in the traffic pattern will free us up to keep



track of what's going on around us. Configure at the same point each time (gear, flaps, power) and you will develop a picture and feel for the pattern. There's a lot going on, and the more we free ourselves up for changes, other traffic, and other distractions, the better our traffic patterns will become."

### Directions to EAA Chapter 64 Hangar/Clubhouse

The Flight Park (1IL4) is located 4 miles SW of Millstadt at 5949 Bohleysville Road, Millstadt, IL.

**FROM BELLEVILLE:** Take 158 west past Millstadt to Roenicke Rd. (approximately 8 miles.) Turn left on Roenicke for 1.8 miles. Turn Right onto Bohleysville Rd. and go 0.2 mile. Look for the big tree on the left and turn left into the gravel drive.

FROM COLUMBIA: Take Rt 3 through Columbia and take Rt 158 toward Millstadt. Drive 2.9 miles to the intersection where Triple Lakes Rd crosses 158 and becomes Bohleysville Rd—the Farmers Inn will be on your left. Turn right onto Bohleysville Rd. Go 1 mile and turn left at the T-intersection. Continue another 0.9 mile. After you go around an S-curve, you'll see the grass runway on your right. Turn right into the gravel driveway by the big tree and continue to the hangar.

**FROM CAHOKIA:** Take Triple Lakes Road (by the old Cahokia bowling alley.) When you get to highway 158 with the Farmers Inn on your left, continue straight onto Bohleysville Rd. Go 1 mile and turn left at the T-intersection. Continue another 0.9 mile. After you go around an S-curve, you'll see the grass runway on your right. Turn right into the gravel driveway by the big tree and continue to the hangar.

**PARKING:** There is limited paved parking area in front of the hangar. It's ok to park on the grass or on the gravel parking area in front of the other hangars. Do not block the gravel driveway. It is used by big and wide farm equipment.

**RUNWAY 24:** Left Traffic. 2,300' available for takeoff; 2,042' available for landing beyond 258' displaced threshold.

**RUNWAY 06:** Left Traffic. 2,300' available.

**NOISE SENSITVE AREA:** AVOID OVERFLIGHT OF ALL HOMES, BUILDINGS, AND LIVESTOCK. A modified straight-in approach is recommended. Do not fly multiple patterns.
