#### Does Santa have to file?

Last year, I published an instrument approach plate into the North Pole, specifically Santa's Workshop Int'l. However, does Santa really have to file an IFR flight plan to get in and out of his home drome at the top of the world? It's Class G airspace. Moreover, there is very little traffic of any type. During all of the flights I have been on over and around the north pole with the 55<sup>th</sup> Weather Reconnaissance Squadron, we never saw another aircraft. Moreover, I never saw the airport or any other facilities. We didn't carry the aforementioned approach plate. The GPS system had not yet been deployed, so there were no RNAV (GPS) approaches at that time. It seems there is no Standard Instrument Departure (SID). In fact, a perusal of SkyVector shows no aeronautical facilities at all. Of course, I also note there is no information on that airport in Nevada. You know the one. Coincidence?
