


Heather. We need all kinds of volunteers, including pilots, engineers, teachers, mentors, and certainly a lot more areas of expertise that we haven't even thought about yet.

The show time for pilots and ground crew will be 0745. They will have ramp space to park your plane if you fly or taxi in. However, you are cautioned to bring your own chocks. background check. We also need folks who can help on the ground to manage the process. That includes checking in the Youthful Enthusiasts, explaining aviation to kids and parents, and help people get to and from the planes safely and efficiently.
