Airplane #1

1. My specifications were laid out in 1933 and I was introduced in 1937
2. 33,984 of me were built
3. I had a V12 engine
4. The first four planes that flew used engines made by Rolls-Royce
5. Performance in my final form was:
 1. Max speed of 400mph at 20,000 feet
 2. Service ceiling of 39,000 ft.
 3. Max range of 528 miles
 4. Rate of climb = 3300 ft/min
6. My armament was 2 machine guns, one cannon, one 550lb bomb
7. I had an empty weight of 4954 lbs, and a gross weight of 6940 lbs.
8. I used NACA airfoil 2R1 14.2
9. I had a 3 bladed propeller
10. I had a crew of one pilot

Airplane #2

1. I was designed in 1947 and built in 1949
2. 736 of me were built
3. I have an empty weight of 850 lbs and a gross weight of 1650 lbs.
4. Maximum speed is 125 mph, stall is 50mph
5. Max range if 480 miles
6. My selling prices was \$2995
7. All of my original registered "N" numbers ended in an "H"
8. 293 of me are still registered globally
9. I am a tube and fabric airplane and seat 4 people.
