WAY Too Much Rain!

He was flying over about 4:30pm, so it's possible many had already left. Dan did not land because there was more potential rain on the way and he had just done some maintenance on his plane. He could see ruts in the camping areas around the runway and taxi areas caused by the very soft and wet ground, but the runway itself looked to be in good condition. There was a pretty violent storm that weekend and they had tree damage as well.

Adams Double Eagle Passes Inspection!

The FAA examiner came to Marshalltown to look at my Double Eagle. I'm happy to say Double Eagle, N33PA, now has an Airworthiness Certificate. If the weather ever improves I will start phase 1 testing. I have taxi tested thru the 20 mph range with one run at 30 mph. I plan to continue taxi testing thru 30 to 35 mph and if all is good I will try some runway flights followed by a local flight close to the airport.
