Young Eagles



This year marks the 30th year of the Young Eagles program. The program was introduced at Oshkosh in 1992 and we've had chapter members fly Young Eagles in all but the first year. Fifty-eight chapter members have flown more than 6000 area youth since the inception of the program. After a challenging two years, we reinstated our monthly rallies and despite four weather cancelations, we managed to fly 229 area youth in 2022, 68 percent of them for their first GA flight.

Ray Scholars Jake Owsley, Ainsley Busenbark and Josh Owsley even flew some Young Eagles with their fresh pilot certificates. We had 36 members & friends volunteer in our Young Eagles program in 2022. Eight of our regular pilots achieved 10 for 2022.

Air Academy Scholarships



We awarded two scholarships to the Air Academy in Oshkosh, WI this year. Bryce Kornett attended the Young Eagles Camp in June and Ainsley Busenbark the Advanced

The EAA Ray Aviation Scholarship is a scholarship program that is funded by the Ray Foundation, managed by EAA, and administered through the EAA Chapter network. In the two years since the program was founded, our chapter has administered five scholarships and is currently working with our sixth scholarships.

In 2019, EAA rolled out the 10-criteria Chapter Recognition Program as a way to recognize its most active and engaged chapters. EAA Leadership Training

Young Eagles Double Credit

To encourage more flight activity and additional chapter rallies, EAA will be offering double Young Eagles credits (\$10 per flight) from January 1, 2023, to July 31, 2023. We use these credits to fund our Air Academy Scholarship Program and to purchase young eagle supplies.

New Young Eagles Registration Process

Due to the popularity of the Young Eagles program, repeat fliers fill up all the open slots as soon as registration is open. It's exciting that so many wish to fly, but leaves no room for new fliers. In an effort to make flights available for first time fliers, we've implemented a new Young Eagle scheduling process. First time fliers may register on Young Eagles Day the 1st -14th of each month. Repeat fliers may register on or after the 15th of each month. Repeat fliers should be encourage to take advantage of the Sport's "Learn to Fly" course and other aviation related opportunities.

30 for 30 Campaign

Volunteer Young Eagles pilots who fly 30 youths between August 1, 2022, and July 31, 2023, will be awarded a commemorative polo shirt. Once pilots reach this milestone, EAA will contact pilots to request their shirt size.

IMC/VMC Clubs

EAA IMC/VMC Clubs are extensions to local EAA chapters and offer monthly meetings in which pilots can network and share knowledge and experience. The meetings use real-world scenarios to engage members, and allow a free exchange of information that improves awareness and skills. The intent is to create a community of pilots willing to share information, provide recognition, foster communications, promote safety, and build proficiency. In the coming year we will alternate between IMC and VMC events monthly. Our first event on the new year, "Starry Night" will be on January 3 at 6:30 pm.
